The currsat report in the efvonth annal Eurvey of the warehousing industry in Ganade and presentey statistice on the operation of the majorig of firm offering wrahousing and etorege facilities to the public. 1 total of l64 compenien filed amual returap compared with 155 in 1949 and 141 in 1948 . The Bureau bas recelved tho earatat cooperatlon of the trade eseociation in an endeavour to fffect more complete and prompter mbiselon of returag but tardy reportiag by a mborlty agala prevented en carlier releas of the information on this important ervice induatry. stetietice are preseated on a resional besi with the Maritimes as group. Yo returns were arailable from Jovfoundland where the ladustry, as such, does not apper to be developed. Returas are included from both members and mon-members of the Canadian Warehousemer Abackation who were conductiag a public warthoning buinone during the year. Cooperatives operating warebouses or torages for tholr ova members are not covered nor were packing houses and other firas operating btorage facilities in conaection with thels respective businesea. For come liras revanue from the motor carrier eogment represented a large percentage of their total recelpte and thay wight more properly be clasead as motor carriers rethor than as werehousing companion: howarer the tebleg bolow indicete the rovenge from ench activity. The sccount other kevenues contains some income from morchandising. Somll food locker planta ars
 well malatainod and with an increage of alae in the aumber of firms rbportiag, the total gross capital investant roge to $\$ 36,292,150$ from $\$ 35,654,799$ in 1949 , Givirg a per company byeraze of $\$ 233$, 489 for 1950 agalast $\$ 229,386$ in the praceding Jear and $\$ 210^{\circ}, 824$ in 1948. Present peak construction costs Alscourage bulldiag, partimularly where the long term campetitive fleld met be constdered. sccrued depreclation latalled $\$ 12,235,092$ ecsingt $\$ 11,873,605$ one year parlier.

Total operating revenues of the 164 flrms reporting amounted to $\$ 21,834,057$ for the year compered with $\$ 20,003,675$ earmed by 155 companios 1a 1949. The overall gain was thus 9.1 p.c. or $\$ 1,830,382$. Storage ravenuee from houseluold goode ragitiered a


 is 1949 or by $9 . ?$ p.c. The widest advancen wart shom 10 wagen, general administration, potor vehtcle operation and other" operating expenmes. Operetiag taxer and licenses took $\$ 680,587$ againat $\$ 647,329$.

Met operating incage remalning for 1950 was $\$ 2,980,562$ cotruared with $\$ 2,821,459$ in 1949. Other 1acome 1mpnoved $\$ 19,182$ to $\$ 127.126$. Total deductione momed to $\$ 645,233$ wih laterent at $\$ 348,729$. Net incomo before incoms tax was $\$ 2,462,455$ for the induetry galia\% $\$ 2.376 .034$ in 1949, but a larger tax contribution of $\$ 756,210$ veraug $\$ 653$, 839 one year oarlier left $\$ 1,706,245$ as net income irarsferable to eurplue or slightly below the $\$ 1,722,195$ reporied for 1949 and vell under the $\$ 2,224,027$ bhow for 1948.

Wet occuplable space furnished by he 1ndutry comprised $19,333,375$ cuble feet for household goode, $24,748,232$ cubic feet for merchandise and $23,852,576$ cubic feet of cold storaga for a total of nearly 78 million cublc feet ae agsingt the estrated 71.3 millon reported 10 r 1949. Occupancy of arailabls apace averaged higher in 1950, vith iacreaned pace reported for the three divielon - houebold goode, gerchandieo and cold storage. More correbpondente are now raporting in cublc foot rather than squre feet. The mecident record for the ladustry show no mployeng killed duriag the gear but 352 sufferad injuries compared with 248 in 1949. Four othor persons were killad and woven ingured agalabt one killed and one ingured in the provious jear, asialy by vehiclea owned and operated by warehousing companies.

For cemparetive purposes obly, a secial table follows, giving the eallent statistics covering lil firiat whict reported gos botb 1949 and 1950. Thes figures whould not bo confased with data shown in the eatn tables or outlined above.
