and wholesale grocery and fruit and vegetable sales contained in other monthly bulletins on the retail and wholesale trade, thus facilitating a comparison of the trends in monthly sales in the two stages of food distribution.

## WHOLESALE TRADE

Grocers' Sales
Dollar sales of wholesale grocers for Canada as a whole were only slightly higher than in December a year ago but were $16 \%$ lower than in November, 1948 according to statements submitted by 72 of the larger wholesalers across the country. Sales for the twelve months of 1948 were $5 \%$ higher than for the year 1947. Results for December, 1948 compared with December, 1947 varied for different regions of the country. Wholesalers in the Maritime Provinces and Quebec combined reported only a slight decline from December a year ago, while those in Ontario registared a decrease of $4 \%$. A gain of $3 \%$ was recorded by wholesale grocers in the Prairie Provinces and of $10 \%$ by those in British Columbia.

## Fruit and Vegetab lo Wholesalers' Sales

For the first time in 1948, sales of fruit and vegetable wholesa leas in December rose above the 1947 level with an increase of $7 \%$. Sales for December also showed a slight increase of $1 \%$ over those for November, 1943. These figures are based on statements received from 48 of the larger dealers across the country. The cumulative figure for the year 1948 remains $13 \%$ below the volume for the 12 months of 1947 . The results for December compared with December a year ago varied by regions. Fruit and vegetable wholesalers in the Maritimes and Quebec combined reported dollar sales $8 \%$ below December, 1947 while gains of $6 \%$ and $17 \%$ were recorded for Ontario and the Western Provinces.

Grocers' Inventories
Stocks in the hands of wholesale grocers at December 31. 1948 were valued only $1 \%$ higher than at the same date last year and $8 \%$ bel ow the value at the beginning of the month. Inventories at the beginning of

December are normally $64 \%$ in excess of sales in that month (based on the average of 1935-1942), while stocks at the beginning, of December, 1948 were valued $42 \%$ higher than the sales volume in that month.

## RETAIL TRADE

Chain Stores - December, 1948 sales of 963 chain store units operated by 26 chain companies in the food retailing field were $28 \%$ higher than sales of 975 stores operated by the same 26 firms in December, 1947. Average sales per store were $\$ 37,243$ in December, 1948 and $\$ 28,827$ in the same month of the previous year.

The Quebec increase of $31 \%$ was highest among the regional changes, while the lowest gain was one of $18 \%$ in the Meritime Provinces.
