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CURRENT TRENDS IN FOOD DISTRIBUTION
February, 1948
This bulletin brings together the information on retail grocery and wholesale grocery and fruit and vegetable sales contained in other monthly bulletins on the retail and wholesale trade, thus facilitating a comparison of the trends in monthly sales in the two stages of food distribution.

WHOLESALE TRADE
Grocers' Sales
The dollar volume of sales of wholesale grocers in Canada for February, 1948 was practically unchanged from that of February a year ago and was $7 \%$ below the January figures, according to statements submitted by 78 of the larger wholesalers across the country.

British Columbia continued to record sales well in advance of last year's dollar volume, while a gain of $9 \%$ was reported by Quebec wholesalers and of $2 \%$ by those in the Maritime Provinces Sales in Ontario and the Prairie Provinces were $5 \%$ and $4 \%$ respectively below February, 1947.

Fruit and Vegetable Dealers' Sales
Sales of wholesalers of fruits and vegetables in February were $7 \%$ below the dollar volume of February, 1947, but were $5 \%$ higher than the dollar sales in January. These figures are based on statements from 49 of the larger wholesalers across Canada. Reports from the Maritimes and Quebec showed a slight increase over February last year, but sales in the other regions continued below the 1947 level. Compared with January, a substantial gain of $34 \%$ was recorded for the Maritimes and Quebec combined and a more moderate increase of $5 \%$ was shown for the Western Provinces. Dollar volume of sales in Ontario was $5 \%$ below that in January.

Grocers' Inventories
Inventories of wholesale grocers at the end of February, 1948 were $4 \%$ higher in value than at the same date a year ago but were $8 \%$ below the value reported at the end of the preceding month. Stocks at the beginning of February are normally $66 \%$ in excess of sales in that month. Wholesale grocers i inventories at the beginning of February this year were valued $49 \%$ in excess of sales.

## RETAIL TRADE

Chain Stores - Fobruary, 1948 sales of 935 chain store units operated by 23 chain companies in the food retailing field were $43 \%$ higher than sales of 929 stores operated by the same 23 firms in February, 1947. Average sales per store in February, 1948 were $\$ 27,498,42 \%$ above the $\$ 19,359$ average for the same month of the previous year.

Extensive gains were recorded in all sections of the country.

Independent Stores - Sales of independent food stores in eastern Canada showed a firmer trend than those in the west. Decreases were reported for each of the three Prairie Provinces. Gains recorded elsewhere were of minor proportions and far below the scale of those shown by chain food stores.
