## CURRENT TRENDS IN FOOD DISTRIBUTION

May, 1948


This bulletin brings together the information on retail grocery and wholesale grocery and fruit and vegetable sales contained in other monthly bulletins on the retail and wholesale trade, thus facilitating a comparison of the trends in monthly sales in the two stages of food distribution.

## MHCLESALE TRADE

Grocers' Sales.
Dollar volume of sales of wholesale grocers in Nay, 1948 was 3\% above that for the same month a year ago but $7 \%$ below the volume for April, 1948. These figures are based on returns for 76 of the larger firms across Canada. The cumulative gain for the first five months of 1948 over the corresponding period of 1347 was $5 \%$ for Canada as a whole. This increase varied between $2 \%$ and $3, \%$ for the provinces east of British Columbia and jumped to $16 / \%$ for British Colurabia.

Compared with hiay last year, sales in May, 1948 showed the ereatest gain in the Prairie Provinces and British Columbia where the volume was $9, \%$ higher. An increase of $7 \%$ in dollar sales was recorded in the Nuritime Provinces, while sales of wholesale grocers in Ontario and quebec dropped $2 \%$ and $3 \%$ respectively.

Fruit and Vegetable Dealers' Sales.
A drop of $26 \%$ from May, 1947 in dollar sales of wholesale fruit and vegetable dealers was recorded from the combined statements of 50 of the larger wholesalexs across the country. Compared with ipril, 1348, May sales were up $4 \%$. Cumulative sales for the year 1948 to date were $15 \%$ lower than in the first five months of 1947.

All regions of the country registered decided declines in volume of fruit and vegetable sales. Sales in the liaritimes and quebec combined were down $30 \%$; Ontar10, $23 \%$; and the Western Provinces, $27 \%$.

Grocers' Inventories.
Stocks in the hands of wholesale grocers at May 3lst were 2.5\% lower in dollar value than at the same date a year ago and $5 \%$ below the value at the end of April this year. Inventories at the beginning of May are normally $26 \%$ in excess of sales in that month (based on the average of 1935-1942). Wholesale erocers' inventories at the beginning of May this year were value $8 \%$ in excess of sales in that month.

## RETAIL TRAIE

Chain Btores - May, 1948 sales of 945 chain store units operated by 24 ciain companies in the food retailing field were $25 \%$ higher than sales of 947 stores operated by the same 24 firms in May, 1947. diverage sules per store in Nay, 1948 were $\$ 31,109,25 \%$ above the $\$ 24,831$ average for the same month of the previous year.

An increase of $34 \%$ in British Columbia featured the chain store results. Establishment of a number of new outlets has probably had some effect upori this result.

Indenendent Stores - Independent food merchants reported little change in volume of sales from Nay last year. In Eastern Canada slight increases occurred, but in the Prairie Frovinces and British Columbia minor declines prevailed.
