CURRENT TRENDS IN FOOD DISTRIBUTION

This bulletin brings together the information on retail grocery and wholesale grocery and fruit and vegetable sales contained in other monthly bulletins on the retail and wholesale trade, thus facilitating a comparison of the trends in monthly sales in the two stages of food distribution.

WHOLESALE TRADE

Wholesale Grocers' Sales

Wholesale grocers' sales in August, 1948 were 17% higher in dollar volume than in August a year ago but fell off 1% from the July volume according to reports submitted by 72 of the larger establishments across Canada. Cumulative sales for the year to date exceeded those for the corresponding period of 1947 by 8%. Gains for the various regions of the country were fairly consistent, ranging between 11% shown in Quebec and 20% in British Columbia.

Fruit and Vegetable Dealers' Sales

August sales of fruit and vegetable wholesalers were 18% below the volume for August, 1947 and 1% lower than in July this year, with sales for the year to date 17% lower than in the first eight months of 1947. Decreases of 16,5 were reported for British Columbia and Ontario, while sales in the Maritime Provinces and Quebec combined were 27% lower than in August last year.

Grocers' Inventories

The value of inventories at the end of August, 1948, as reported by wholesale grocers, was 11,0 above that on the same date a year ago and 2% higher than at the end of July this year. Inventories at the beginning of August are normally 11,0 in excess of sales in that month (based on the average of 1935 - 1942), while stocks at the beginning of August this year were valued 10, lower than the sales wo lume for that month.

RETAIL TRADE

Chain Stores - August, 1948 sales of 978 chain store units operated by 26 chain companies in the food retailing field were 16% higher than sales of 976 stores operated by the same 26 firms in August, 1947. Average sales per store were \$28,611 in August, 1948 and \$24,650 in the same month of the previous year.

Increases in Quebec, Ontario and British Columbia compared favourably with the average result, but in the Maritime and Prairie Provinces, August sales rose only 7% and 8% respectively over August, 1947.

Independent Stores - Sales of independent food stores were 4% higher in August this year than in August, 1947. Saskatchewan showed a slight decline from August last year. In other sections of the country, moderate gains were reported, the highest being a 9% increase in Alberta.
