## CURRENT TREMDS IN FOOD DISTRIBUTION

September, 1948
This bulletin brings togother the information on retail grocery and wholesale procery and fruit and vegetable sales contained in other monthly bullotins on the retail and wholesale trade, thus facilitating a comparison of the trends in monthly sales in the two stages of fond distribution.

## WHOLESALE TRALE

## Grocers: Sales

The dollar volume of sales of wholosale grocers in September, 1948 was $9 \%$ in excess of September, 1947 and $5 \%$ higher than in August, 1948, according to statements from 74 of the larger wholesalers across the country. The September gain was in line with that shown by the cumulative ficure for the year to date which was $8.5 \%$ above the corresponding period of 1947. Increases over 1947 in the Prairie Provinces and in Ontario amounted to 15 and $11 \%$ respectively while lesser gains of between 2 and $6 \%$ were recorded in the other regions.

## Fruit and Vegotable Dealers' Sales

September sales of fruit and vegetable wholesalers in Canada were only $2 \%$ below the Soptember, 1947 figure and were $10 \%$ above August, 1948. Cumulative sales for the first nine months of 1948 were $16 \%$ below the dollar volume in the corresponding period of 1947. Fruit and vegetable wholesalers' sales in the ifestern Provinces rose $7 \%$ above the September, 1947 volune but this gain was offset by decreases of $20 \%$ in the Maritimes and Quebec combinod and $8 \%$ in Ontario.

Grocers' Inventories
Stocks in the hands of wholesale procers at the end of September were $16 \%$ higher in value than at the same date a year ago and $11 \%$ higher than at the beginning of the month. Inventories at the beginning of September are normally $10 \%$ in excess of sales in that month (based on the averape of 1935-1942), while stocks at the boginning of September this year were $13 \%$ lower than the sales volume for that month.

## RETAIL TRADE

Chain Stores - September, 1948 sales of 964 chain store units operated by $\overline{26}$ chain companies in tho food retailinf field were $24 \%$ higher than sales of 965 stores oporated by the same 26 firms in September, 1947. Averape sales per store were 30,515 in September, 1948 and $\$ 24,632$ in the same month of the previous year.

Increases amounted to more than $20 \%$ in all sections of the country except the Liaritime Provinces where the gain was held to $7 \%$.
