CURPENT TRENDS IN FOOD DISTRIBUTION
March, 1949
This bulletin brings together the information on retail grocery and wholesale grocery and fruit and vegetable sales contained in other monthly bulletins on the retail and wholesale trade, thus facilitating a comparison of the trends in monthly sales in the two stages of food distribution.

WHOLESAIE TRADE
Grocers' Sales
Wholesale grocers' sales in March, 1949 were $7 \%$ higher in dollar volume than in March a year ago and were $14 \%$ above the February, 1949 volume according to statements from 77 of the larger wholesalers across Canada. Cumulative sales for the first quarter of 1949 exceeded the dollar volume for the corresponding period of 1948 by $4 \%$. Quebec, with a decrease of $4 \%$, was the only province to register a drop in sales from March a year ago. Cumulative sales for the year to date for this province were $7 \%$ below the sales in the first three months of 1948. Other regions registered gains as follows: British Columbia, $4 \%$ the Maritime Provinces, $6 \%$ Ontario, $8 \%$ and the Prairie Provinces, $12 \%$.

Fruit and Vegetable Dealers' Sales
Dollar sales of fruit and vegetable wholesalers showed an increase of l8\% over Merch, 1948 and $21 \%$ over February, 1949, bringing the sales for the year to date to $10 \%$ in excess of the sales volume in the corresponding period of 1948. Ontario dealers reportod an incrense of $15 \%$, while gains of $19 \%$ and $21 \%$ were registered in the Maritime Provinces and the lectorn Provinces resmectively.

Grocers Inventories
Dollar value of stocks in the hands of wholesale grocers at the ond of March was $3 \%$ higher than at the same date a year ago but $10 \%$ bel ow the value reported for the end of February. Stocks on hand at the beginning of March are normally $49 \%$ in excess of sales in that month (based on the average for 1936 - 1942). Thalesale grocers inventories at the beginning of March this year were valued $23 \%$ in excess of sales in that month.

## RETAIL TRADE

Due to a change in the method of computing retail sales estimates the summary appearing below includes grocery, and grocery and combination stores, but does not give representation to meat markets for which separate sal es estimates are available.

Chain Stores - March, 1949 sal os of 961 ohain store units operated by 23 chein companies in the food retailing field were $14 \%$ higher than sales of 978 stares operated by the same 23 firms in March, 1948. Average sales per store were $\$ 33,878$ in March, 1949 and $\$ 29.129$ in the same month of the previous year.

Independent Stores - Sales of Independent food stores inoroased $8 \%$ in Warch, 1949 compared with March, 1948 . Provincial increases are shown in the following table.
