## CURRENT TRENDS IN FOOD DISTRIBUTION, AUGUST, 1940

## Introduction

Indexes reflecting current trends in food distribution in Canada have been published for some years, indexes of retail and wholesale grocery trading establishments forming components of the two regular monthly bulletins on retail and wholesale trade issued by the Internal Trade Branch of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics. This series brings together in one report the information on retail and wholesale grocery sales contained in the other bulletins thus facilitating a comparison of the trends in monthly sales in the two stages of food distribution.

## Wholesale Trade

Sales of 77 wholesale grocery houses average 1 per cent higher in August, 1940 than in August, 1939 and were 8 per cent above the level of July, 1940, unadjusted indexes on the base 1930 equals 100 standing at 121.1 for August, 1940; 112.3 for July, 1940; 122.0 for June, 1940; and 120.0 for hugust, 1939. The 1 per cent increase over July of the previous year compares with unchanged sales in the July corres-ponding-month comparison and with increases of 9 per cent and 25 per cent in June and Hay over the same months of the previous year. Dollar value of sales for the first eight months of this year averaged 11 per cont higher than for the corresponding eightmonth period of 1939.

The tronds in the five oconomic divisions of the country were widely varied and ranged from an increase in sales of 16 por cont in British Columbia to a docroase of 4 por cent in the Prairios. The Naritimos reported a gain of 5 per cent, Quebec 2 por cent, whilo Ontario reported a fractional increase of only 0.5 per cont.

## Stocks

Inventories carried by the wholesale grocery trade were 18 per cent higher at the end of August than on the corresponding date of 1939, but were 4 per cont lower than at the end of July, 1940. Stocks on hand at any period must be considered in relation to sales in the immediately following period. Stocks on hand at the beginning of August normally amount to approximately 111 per cent of the August turnover. Stocks on hand at the end of July formed 124 per cent of the August sales, indicating that stocks on hand at the beginning of the month were still in excess of the normal inventory position for that time of year.

## Chain Stores

Sales of 1,155 chain store units operated by 28 chain companies in the food retailing field averaged 28 per cent higher in August, 1940, than the sales of 1,328 units operatod by the same 28 firms in the corresponding month of 1939. Chain sales in the province of British Columbia were up 35 per cent; Quebec and Ontario, 29 por cent; and the Prairio Provinces, 17 per cent. Average daily sales for grocery and meat chains were 18 per cont higher in August, $\mathbf{1 9 4 0}$, than in August, 1939.

## Independent Stores

Dollar sales of 1,046 inủopendent grocery and combination stores were 14 por cent highor in August, 1940 than in August, 1939. Results on a geographical besis indicate that sales increasos were recorded in every soction of tho country, ranging from a gain of 18 por cont in the Maritimos to ono of 9 per cont in Saskatchowan and British Columbia. Ontario reportod an incraaso of 14 por cont; hlborta, 11 por cont; and Queboc and Manitobe were the same with a gain of 13 por cont.
