## CURRENI TRENDS IN FOOD DISTRIBUTION, SEPTEYBER, 1940

## Introduction

Indexes reflecting currant tronds in food distribution in Canada have boen publishod for sone years, indezes of retail and wholosale grocory trading establishments forming components of the two regular monthly bulletins on retail and wholesale trade issued by the Internal Trade Branch of the Dominion Burcau of Statistics. This series brings together in one report the information on retail and wholesale grocory salos contained in the othor bullotins thus facilitating a comm parison of the trends in monthly sales in tho two stagos of lood distribution.

## Thologice Trade

Salos of 77 wholusnlo grocery housos avoraged 27 por cont lowar in Soptember, 1940 than in Soptember, 1939 but were practical1y unchanged from the lovel of sugust, 1940, unadjustod indoxus, on the baso 1930 equals 100, standing at 119.9 for Soptomber, 1940; 120.6 for sugust, 1940; 112.3 for July, 1940 and 104.9 for Soptomber, 1939. Heavy invontory buying by tho ratail trado roachod on unusually high lovol in Soptumbor, 1939 and, whilo wholosalo salos in Soptomber, 1940 havo docroasod 27 por cont they are still 4 por cont above tho loval of Soptomor, 1938. The dollar viluo of selos for tho first nino months of 1940 avoragod 5 por cont highor than for tho corresponding ninc-month poriod of the provious yoar.

Soptombor salos of wholesalo grocory firms, when oxaminod by rogions, indicato that doclinos wore general throughout tho Dominion. In tho iifaritimos selus droppod 22 por cont below tho lovol of Soptamber a yoar ago; in Onterio and tho Prairios solos docroasud 26 por cont; in British Columbia, 31 por cont; whilo is Quoboc the drop cmounted to 32 por cont.

## Stocks

Inventories carried by the wholesale grocery trade were 5 per cent higher at the end of September than on the corresponding date of 1939 , but were 1 per cent lower than at the end of August, 1940. Stocks on hand at any period must be considered in relation to sales in the immediately following period. Stocks on hand at the beginning of September normally anount to approximately 114 per cent of the September turnover. Stocks on hand at the end of August formed 127 per cent of the September sales, indicating that stocks on hand at the beginning of the month were still in excess of the normal inventory position for that time of year.

# Retail Trade 

## Chain Stores

Sales of 1,105 chain store units operated by 29 chain companies in the food retailing field averaged 8 per cent lower in September, 1940 than the salos of 1,268 units operated by the same 29 firms in the corresponding month of 1939. Chain sales in the province of British Colunbia were down 3 per cent; Ontario, 6 per cent; the Prairie frovinces, 12 per cent. sverage daily sales for grocery and meat chains were 3 per cent higher in September, 1940 than in September, 1939.

Independent Storos

Dollar sales of 1,048 indopencent grocery and combination stores were 9 per cent lower in September, 1940 than in Septewber, 1939. Results on a geographical basis indicate that sales docreases vere recorded in every section of the country rancing from a decline of 3 per cent in the Liaritimes to ono of 12 per cent in the three most westerly provincos, Saskatchowan, Alborta and British Columbia. Quobec reportod a docline of 8 por cent; Ontario and Lanitoba were tho same with a decline of 10 por cont.
