CURRENI TRENDS IN FOOD DISTRIBUTION, OCTOBKR, 1941

## Introduction

Indexes refleoting current trends in food distribution in Canada have been published for some years, indexes of retail and wholesale grocery trading establishments forming components of the two regular monthly bulletins on retail and wholesale trade 1ssued by the Internal Trade Branoh of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics. This series brings together in one report the information on retail and wholesale grocery sales contained in the other bulletins thus facilitating a compariaon of the trende in monthly asles in the two stages of food distribution.

## Wholesale Trade

Sales of 72 of the larger wholasale grocery houses in Canode averaged 16 per coht higher in October of this year than last and stood 3 per cent higher than in September. The 16 per cent increase compared with Ootober, 1940, is lower than geins recorded during recent monthe of this year compared with lest. September sales stood 31 por cent higher than in September, 1940; August sales were up 29 per cent and July, 36 per cent. Sales for the first ten monthe of 1941 stand 18 per cent highor than during the corresponding period of 1940.

Increases in october of this year compared with last were greater in the extreme east and west than in other parts of Canada. Britiah Columbia aalea gained 30 per cent for the month and were up 20 per cent for the yoar to date. Sales in the Maritime Provinces stood 21 per cent higher in Ootober of this year thar last and were up 21 per cent for the year to dato. Increases over Ootober, 1940, for the other regions with gains for the year to date in brackets are as follows: Quebec,' 9 per oent ( 17 per cent); ontar10, 17 per cent (17 per oent): Prairie Provinoes, 13 per cent ( 16 per cent).

Inventories carried by wholesale grocers averaged 26 per cent highor at the end of October, 1941, than 1940 and were up 7 per oent compared with the end of September. Stocks on hand at the beginnting of ootober normally form approximately 118 per cent of Dotober sales. Stocks on hand at the beginning of October, 1941, formed 128 per cent of October sales indioating that the inventory situation at the beginning of the month was silghtly above the normal position.

## Rotrin Trade

## Chain Stores

Sales of 990 chain store units operated by 26 chain compenies in the food retailing field averaged 29 per cent higher in Ootober, 1941, than aales of 1,067 units operated by the same 27 firms in October a year ago. Average anlea per store were $\$ 13,533$ in October of this jear, 39 per cent greater than the $\$ 9,743$ average in the same month of 1940. A considerable reduction in the number of stores operated by the reportins chain companies is reaponaible, to some extent, for the froreased eales folume per store.

Increases in varioute regions of the country were as follows: 38 per cont in Quebec, 28 per cent in British Columbia, 27 per cent in Ontario, and 23 per cent in the Prairie Provinees. Average daily sales for food chains increased 27 per cent in October of this year over last.

## Independont Stores

Dollor eales of 1,019 independent grocery and combination grocery and meat storos were 15 per cent higher in October of this year than last, gains ranging from 6 per cent in Alberta to 18 per oent in the Maritime Provinces and Quebec being reported. Increase for other provinoes were 7 per cent for Saskatchewan, 10 per cent for Britioh Columbia, 12 per cent for Manitoba, and 15 per cent for Ontario.
