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## Introduction

Indexes reflecting current trenda in fooi distribution in Canada have been published for some years, indexes of retail and wholesale grocery trading establishments forming componants of the two regular monthly bulletins on retail and wholesale trade issued by tho Internal Trade Branch of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics. This series beings tegether in one report the information on retail and wholosalo grovery saios conteined in the other bulletins thus facilitating a comparison of tho trendas in monthly sales in the two stages of food distribution.

## Wholsuale rady

Sales of 72 of the larger grocary wholssele houpes, as measured by dollar volume, remained unchanged in August of this year sompared with August, 1941, and declined 1 per cent from July. Sales for the first eight months of the current year stand 10 par cent higher than for the corresponding period a year ago. Ontario recorded ans incroase of 7 per cent in sales over August of last year while a 3 per cent increase was reported in the Maritime Provinces. Sales in Britisi Columbje deciined by 7 per cent while 6 per cent less business was transacted in ine Prairioso Grocery wholesalers in Quebec reported no change in sales from August: 1941.

Stocks on hand at the end of August, 2.542, wero valued 10 per cent lower than on the corresponding date of last year, and declined by 7 per cent from the value of inventories reported on Ju? $\mathrm{y} 31,3.942$. Etocks on hand at the beginning of August are aormally 11 par cant in excess of the volume of business transacted in that month. Stocks on hand at the beginning of August this year were at the normal steck position, wholesalers reporting inventory holdings 11 per cert in exvoss of the volume of business transacted during that month.


## Retail Trade

Chain Stores
Sales of 953 chain store units operated by 24 chain companies in the food retailing field averaged 6 per cent higher in August, 1942 , than sales of 999 units operated by the same 24 firms in August a year ago. Average sales per store were 14,420 in August, 1942,11 per cent greater than the 812,967 average for the same month of 1942.

Increases in various regicns of the country were as follows: 11 per cent in Quebec, 3 per cent in Ontaric, 21 per cent in the Prairie Provinces, and 8 per cent in British Columbia.

## Independent Stores

Sales of 925 independent grocery or grocery and meat stores averaged $l l$ per cent higher in August of this year than last, all regions of the country, except Saskatchewan, contributing to the increase. Sales in Saskatchewan remained unchanged from fugust, 1941. Gains recorded for the other provinces ware as follows: Maritimes, 6 per cent; Quebec, 15 per cent; Ontario, 10 per cent; Manitoba, 8 per cent; ilborta, 7 per cent; and British Columbia, 17 per cent.
