Thiexas reliecting current trends in food distribution in Canada have been published for some years, indexes of retail and wholsale grocery trading estabilishients forming coriponents of the two reguler monthly oulletins on rotail and wholesale trade issued by the Internal Trad Branch of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics. This series brings together in one report the information on rotail and wholesalo grocory sales contained in the other bulleizins thus facilitating a comparison of the trends in monthly sales in the two stages of food distrioution.

## molosale Trade

The dollac volume of sales transacted by 72 of tho larger grocery wholesale establishronts incrensed by 5 per cont in Soptember of this year over Soptembsr, 1941, and increased 8 por cont over fugust salos. Cumulative figuros for the first nine months of the current yoar stand 23 per cent higher than for the corresponding poriod last yoar. i.ll rogions of the country contributod to the 5 por cont increase. Ontario cirao first in point of vion of incroased businoss, recording a grin of 9 por cont. Soptombor salos incroasod by 6 per cont in tho hiaritimos over Soptombor, 1941, 5 por sont in Quobac, and 3 por cont in both the Prairios and British Columbia.

Invantorios hold by grocary wholoselors waro valuod 14 par cont lower at tho und of Soptomber, 1942, than on the corresponding deto of last your, but incroasus by 5 por cont ovor tho veluo of stocks roportod on hand on August 31, 1942. Stocks on hend at tho boginning of Soptomor are normelly 5 por cont in excess of tho volume of business transactod in that month. Value of stocks on hend at tho bogiming of Soptomber this yoar was on a par with tho anount of businoss transactod during tho month, indicating thet tho stock position at tho bogenning of Soptombor, 1942, was below tho normel position for thet poriod of tho yorr.

## Retail Trade

## Chain Stores

Sales of 989 chain store units operated by 25 chain companies in the food retailing field averaged 3 per cent higher in September, 1942, than sales of 1,037 units operated by the same 25 firms in September a year ago. Average sales per store were $\$ 12,955$ in September, 1942,8 per cent greater than the $\$ 11,977$ average for the seme month of 1941.

Sales increased by 14 per cent in the Prairie Provinces, 11 per cent in British Columbia and 3 per cent in Quebec over September, 1941. Ontario recorded a decline of less than 1 per cent.

## Independent Stores

Sules of 956 irdependent grocery or grocery and meat stores averaged 14 por cont higher in seotembe: of this year than last. Incroases ranged from 7 to 22 per cont. Gains recorded for the privincus lere as follows: Miaritimes, 10 per cent; Quebec, 15 per cent; Ontario, 14 per cent; ianitoba, 12 por cont; Saskatchewan, 7 por cont; Alberta, 15 por cent; and British Columbia, 22 per cent.
