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CURRENT TRANS IN FOOD DISTRIBUTION, SEPTEMBER, 1942

Indexes reflecting current trends in food distribution in Canada have been published for some years, indexes of retail and wholesale grocery trading establishments forming components of the two regular monthly bulletins on retail and wholesale trade issued by the Internal Trade Branch of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics. This series brings together in one report the information on retail and wholesale grocery sales contained in the other bulletins thus facilitating a comparison of the trends in monthly sales in the two stages of food distribution.

Wholesale Trade

The dollar volume of sales transacted by 72 of the larger grocery wholesale establishments increased by 5 per cent in September of this year over September, 1941, and increased 8 per cent over August sales. Cumulative figures for the first nine months of the current year stand 10 per cent higher than for the corresponding period last year. All regions of the country contributed to the 5 per cent increase. Ontario came first in point of view of increased business, recording a gain of 9 per cent. September sales increased by 6 per cent in the Maritimes over September, 1941, 5 per cent in Quebec, and 3 per cent in both the Prairies and British Columbia.

Inventories held by grocery wholosalers were valued 14 per cent lower at the end of September, 1942, than on the corresponding date of last year, but increased by 5 per cent over the value of stocks reported on hand on August 31, 1942. Stocks on hand at the beginning of September are normally 5 per cent in excess of the volume of business transacted in that month. Value of stocks on hand at the beginning of September this year was on a par with the amount of business transacted during the month, indicating that the stock position at the beginning of September, 1942, was below the normal position for that period of the year.

Retail Trade

Chain Stores

Sales of 989 chain store units operated by 25 chain companies in the food retailing field averaged 3 per cent higher in September, 1942, than sales of 1,037 units operated by the same 25 firms in September a year ago. Average sales per store were \$12,955 in September, 1942, 8 per cent greater than the \$11,977 average for the same month of 1941.

Sales increased by 14 per cent in the Prairie Provinces, 11 per cent in British Columbia and 3 per cent in Quebec over September, 1941. Ontario recorded a decline of less than 1 per cent.

Independent Stores

Sales of 956 independent grocery or grocery and meat stores averaged 14 per cent higher in September of this year than last. Increases ranged from 7 to 22 per cent. Gains recorded for the provinces were as follows: Maritimes, 10 per cent; Quebec, 15 per cent; Ontario, 14 per cent; Manitoba, 12 per cent; Saskatchewan, 7 per cent; Alberta, 15 per cent; and British Columbia, 22 per cent.
