## CURRENT TRENDS IN FOOD DISTRIBUTION, OCTOBER, 1943

Indexas reflecting current trends. in food distribution in Canada have been published for some years, indexes of retail and wholesale grocery sales forming components of the two regular monthly bulletins on retail and wholesale trade issued by the Internal Trade Branch of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics. This series brings together in one report the information on retail and wholesale grocery saies contained in the other bulletins thus facilitating a comparison of the treads in monthly sales in the two stages of food distribution.

## Wholesale Trade

Reports received from 70 of the larger grocery wholesale establishments indicated a 7 per cent deoline in saies in Ontario, 1943, compared with October of last year. The dollar voiume of business transacted during the month decreased 10 per cent from Septamber: 1943.. Cumulative figures for the ten-month period of the current year stand 2 per cent higher than for the corresponding period last year. The 7 per cent decline below october, 1942 reflects a falling off in wholesals grocery trading in all regions of the country except the Maritime Provinces where sales increased 11 per cont. Dollar sales decreased by 15 per cent in the Prairies; 11 per cent in Quebec: 9 per oent in British Columbia; and 3 per cont in Ontario.

Stocks on hand at the end of October: 1943, were valued 4 per cent higher than on the corresponding date of last year, and increased by 10 per cent over the ralue of stocks reported on hand September 30, 1943. Stocks on hand at the beginning of October are normally 18 per cent in excess of the amount of business transacted in that month. Stocks on hand at the beginning of October of this year were 10 per cent in excess of the volume of business transacted, indicating that the stock position at the beginning of October, 1943, was below the normal position for that period of the year.

## Retail Sales

Chain Stores
Sales of 951 chain store units operated by 27 chain companies in the food retailing field averaged 7 per cent lower in October, 1943, than sales of 975 units operated by the same 27 firms in October a year ago. Average sales per store were $\$ 14,102$ in October, 1943,4 per cent lower than the $\$ 14,741$ average for the same month of 1942.

Sales decreased by 12 per cent in Quebec, 6 per cent in Ontario, 2 per cent in the Prairie Provinces and 9 per cent in British Columbia.

## Independent Stores

Sales of 877 independent jrocery or grocery and meat stores increased in dollar volume by 6 per cent in October 1943 s over the value of business transacted in the same month of last year. The increase was shared by all regions of the country except British Columbia, the following gains being recorded over Octobers 1942: Maritimes, 9 per cent; Quebec. 4 per cent; Ontario. 6 per cent; Manitoba, 9 per cent; Saskatchewan, 10 per cent; and Alberta, 14 per cento Sales were practically unchanged in British Columbia.
