CURPENT TRENDS IN FOOD DISTFIBUTION, JULY2 1943

Indexes reflecting currert trends in food distrikution in Canada have been putlished for some years, indexes of retail and wholesale grocery trading establishments forming components of the two regular monthly bulletins on retail and wholesale trade issued by the Internal Trade Branch of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics. This series brings together in one report the information on retail and wholesale grocery sales contained in the other bulletias thus faciiitatine a comparison of the trends in moathly sales in the two staetes of food distribution.

## Tholesale Trude

Sulea of 72 of the larter wholesale grocery housses in Canada averaged 4 per cent higher in Juiy than in June and were up by 9 per cent :ompared with July, 1942. The increase over Juiy, 1922 wais considerably higher than the avemge giln recorded in earlier months, cumulative figures for the first seven months of the current year standing only 4 per cent above the corresponding jeriod of $134 \%$.

Sales in quebec and British Columbia averaged 2 per cent lower in July of this year than last whils the other tiree economic divisions for which separate fibures are compiled recorded increuses. Sulos in the Muritimes and Ontario were up 10 per cent wile the pririe provincas reported twice as large a guin with an lucreaze of 20 per cent.

Doliar value of invantories held by the wholeale trade sueraged 12 per cent lower at the end of July this yeur compred with the corresponding date a year ago. Wholesale grocers' stocks at the end of June are norrally 5 per cent higher than the amount of buoiness realized in July. Inventories at the end of June were 10 per cent lower than the volume of busiaess transacted in July thio year, indicating that the stock position in the wholestile erocery trade at the beginaing of July was considerably below the normal situation for this perion of the year.

## Retail Trade

## Chain Stores

Sules of 388 chain ctore units operatau by 25 thain companies in the food retailing ficld averaged 1 per cent highor in July, 1943 , than sales of 917 units operated by the same 25 firms in July a yesr ago. Average bales per store were \$15,482 in July, 1943,4 per cent higher than the \$14,325 averige for the same month of 1342.

Sales decreased by 1 per cent in Cuebec, 1 per cent in Ontario, while the Pruirie Provinces and British Columbia recorded gains of 7 and 3 per vent respectiveily.

## Independent Stores

Sales of 865 independent grocery or erocery and neat stores inereased in dollar volume by 17 per cent in July, 2340 , over the value of business transacted in the same month of last year. The increase was shared by all recions of the country, the follorine sains being recorded over July, 1912: Maritimes, 23 per cent; Quebec, 15 por cent; Onterio, 17 per cent; Maitobu, 22 per cent; Saskatchevan, 17 per cent; Albertil, 20 per cent; British Columbia, 12 per cent.
