## CURET TRIED I: FOOD DISTMIBTICN, DECD DER, 1344

Indexes reflecting current trends in food distribution in Canada have been published for some years, indexes of retail and wholesale grocery sales forming conponents of the two regular monthly bulletins on retail and wholesale trade issued by the Merchandising and Services Branch of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics. This series hines to actor in one report the information on retail and wholesale grocery sales contained in the other bulletins tins facilitating a comparison of tie trends in monthly sales in tho two stases of food distribution.

## Wholesale Trade

December: sales transacted by 74 of tie larger grocery wholesale establishments in Canada increased 5 per cent over the volume or business reported in December, 1943 , but were 12 per cent below the dollar business realized in Novenver, 1944. Total sales for tie e year 1344 increased 13 per cent over the 1343 level of trading. Increases in the annual comparison were fairly uniform for all regions of the country, gains ranging from 10 per cont in the Prairie Provinces and British Columbia to 13 per cent in Ontario.

The December increase over Decomber, 1343 was shared by all regions of the country except the Prairie Provinces where sales declined by $\varepsilon$ per cent. Increases on a regional basis are as follows: Maritime Provinces, 5 per cent; quebec, 7 per cent; Ontario, 10 per cert; British Columbia, 18 per cent.

Inventories held at the end of December, 1344 were valued 2 fer cent lower than the stacks on hand at the end of December, 1943, but exceeded by 4 per cent the value of inventories in the hands of wholesale grocers on November 30, 1341. Stocks at the beginning of December are normally 64 per cent in excess of the volume of business transacted in that month as reflected in the average experience over the years 1935 to 1942. Stocks at the beginning of December, 1944 , were 15 per cent in excess of the volume of business transacted, indicating that the inventory position at the beginning of December, 1944 lad dropped considerably below the normal position for that period of the year.
