## CURIENT TRENDS IN: FOOD DIETRIBUTION, OCTOBER, 1945

Indexes reflectine current trends in foou distribution in Canada have been published for some years, indexes of retail erocery axa wholesule erocery and fruits and vegetebles sales forming components of the two reguler monthly bulletins on retaill and wholesele trace issued by the luerchandising and Services Branch of the Dominion Bureau of statistics. This series brines together in one report the information on rettil erocery and wholesale erocery and fruit and vegetables sales contained in the other bulletins thus facilitatine a comparison of the trends in monthly sales in the two stages of food aistribution.

## whol esale Trade

Wholesale grocery sales 2 ncreased 11 per cent in October of this year over 1944, anu auvancea 14 per cent over the aollar volume of sales transacted in September, 1945, accoraing to returns received from 77 of the larger wholesale erocery establishments in Canaaa. A substailial eain of $2 \dot{L}$ per cent was recorded in British Columbia and Ontario sales were up 14 per cent. Sumler gains in the other regions were 10 per cent in the Prairie Provinces, 6 per cent in the buritime Provinces and 2 per cent in quebec. heregate figures for the year to cate were 7 per cent greater than sales transacted in the seme porioa of 1944.

October wholesale fruit and vegetable sales gainad bl per cent over sales of Uctuber, 1944 but ceclinea is per cent from the septermber volume of trading. The 31 per cent increaso retlects major eains in all reefons of the country. Sales advanced 37 per cent in the waritime provincos and quebec, $3 \dot{\text { an per cent in Ontario, and } 27 \text { per }}$ cent in the western Provinces. Total sales for the year atand 16 per cent above the Jemuery - October perici of 1944.

A aeeline of 11 per cent in wholesale erocery inventories was recoraed betweea Vetober bi, of this year and last, but stocks increased 8 per cent over the inveatorios reported un hanc at the end of September. Stocks on hand at the beginnine of uctober are normally 17 per cent in excess of the business transacted in that montt. Stocks on hand at the beeiming of October this year were 10 rece cent below the volune of October sales, indicatiag that the inventory position at the betimane of October was considerably belov the nomal situation for that period of the year.

October, 1945 sales of 912 chain store units operated by $\check{2} 4$ chain companies in the food retailing field were 9 per cent higher than sales of 939 stores operated by the same c 4 frims in October a year aco. Average sales per store in October of this year were $\$ 17,55 \%$, i's per cent higher than the $\$ 15,576$ averace for the same month of 1944.

Increases for the various regions ranged from 7 per cent in ontario to 18 per cent in British Columbia.

## Independent stores

Sales of inciependent food retailers averaged 8 per cent higher in october of this year than last. With the exception of the Liaritime Provinces with a gain of 4 per cent, percentage increases over October a year aco were fairly uniform for all provinces, raneine from 7 per cent in quebec and inberta to 18 per cent in Saskatchewan.
