

## CURRENT TRENDS IN FOOD DISTRIBUTION, DECEMBER, 1946

Indexes reflectine curcent trends in food distribution in Canada have been published for some years, indexes of retail grocery and wholesale grocery and fruits and vegetables sales forming components of the two regular monthly bulletins on retail and wholesale trade issued by the Merchandising and Sorvices Statistics of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics. This series brings torother in one report the information on retail grocery and wholesale grocery und fruit and vegetable sales contained in the other bulletins thus facilitatine a comparison of the trends in monthly sales in the two stages of food distribution.

## Tholesalc Trade

Wholesale grocers' sales in December, 1946 were 17 per cent greater in dollar volume than in the same month last year according to statements received from 73 of the larger firms across Canada. There was a seasonal drop from November of 13 per cent. The increase was general throughout the different regions of canada, the greatest pain, 27 per cent, being recorded for British Columbia. Sales of wholesale grocers in Quebec were 21 per cent above those for Decomber, 1945 and in the Prairios, 18 per cent. Lesser, but still substantial, increases were reported in ontario and the Maritime Provinces whore wholesalers' sales were 13 and 11 per cent higher respectively than in December last year. Preliminary figures for the twelvo months of 1946 indicate that wholessle crocers' sales during that year were 16 por cont above the 1945 volure.

December sales of fruit and vegetable wholesalors were 7 per cent below the volumo in December, 1945, continuing, the trend that has been in evidence during the immediately preceding months, but were 5 per cont above those for November, 1946. These figures are based on statements from 46 of the larger wholesalers in this trade. Sales in the Western Provinces, which had been showinf increases over 1945 in the past months despite decreased sales in the East, dropped in December to practically the same level as in December, 1945. A decrease of 12 per cent was recorded in the Maritimes and Queboc combined, while sales of wholesalers of freits and vogetables in Ontario dropped 11 per cent below December a year apo. Sales for the twelve months of 1946 were 12 per cent higher than those in the year 1945.

The value of stocks in the hands of wholesale procers at the end of December, 1946 was 44 per cont higher than at the same date last year and 13 per cent above the value of inventory at the end of November, 1946. Inventories at the beginning of Decomber are normally 64 per cent in excess of sales in that month. Stocks at the beginninf of December this year wore valued 15 per cent higher than the sales during that month, indicating that the inventory position of wholesale arocers is still below nomal.

December, 1946 sales of 866 chain store units operated by 24 chain companies in the food retailing field were 5 per conthicher than sales of 873 stores operated by the same 24 firns in December, 1945. Average sales per store in December, 1946 were $\$ 21,873,6$ per cent above the $\$ 20,691$ averape for the same month of the previous year.

British Columsia reported the largest increase in chain food store sales in December of this year compared with last. A gain of 10 per cent in that province and one of 7 pur cent in Quebec were the only two which exceederl the increase of 5 per cent for the Dominion. Gains of 4 per cent and 2 per cent occurred in ontario and the Prairie Provinces respectively, while the Karitime Provinces showed a fractional decrease below Decembor, 1945.


## Independent Stores

Independent stores did 4 per cent more business in December this year than in 1945. The vestern prorinces reported the larger increases. British Columbia and Alberta experienced 9 per cent eains, which were closely followed by a 7 per cent advance in Kanitoba. Saskatchewan, Ontario and Quebec each recorded 4 por cent rains, while sales in the Maritime Provinces were practically unchanged from December uf last year.
