## CURRENT TRETVA M FOOD DISTRIBUTIOH, JULY, 1947

Indexes reflectirg current trends in food distribution in Canada have been published for sone years, indexes of retail procery and wholesale grocery and fruits and veretables sales forming components of the two regular monthly bulletins on retail and wholesale trade issued by the Ierchendisins and Services Statistics of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics. This series brings togetler in one report the information on retail crocery and wholesale grocery and fruit and vegetable sales contained in the other bulletins thus facilitating a comparison of the trends in monthly sales in the two stages of food distribution.

## Wholesale Trade

Dollar volune of sales by wholesale grocers for July, 1947 was 18 per cent hicher than for July, 1946 and 8 per cent above that for June, 1947. These firures arc based on statenents received from the larger wholesale houses across Canada. Due to delay in receipt of returns from ontario, it has not been possible to publish reliable results for that province. It has also been necessary to withhold the dollar volune for canada as a whole until a nore complete coverage is obtained. Sales for the othor resions registered the following increases over July, 1946: British Columbia, 27 per cent; Uuebec, 22 per cent; Frairie Frovinces, 17 ner cent; and Maritime Frovinces, 11 per cent. Cumulative sales for the first seven months of 1947 were 15 per cent higher than for the corresponding period of 1946.

Sales of wholesalers of fruits and vergetables in July, 1947 were 3 per cent below July, 1346 and 1 per cent higher than in June, 1947. Dollar volume of sales of fruits and vecetables in ontario declined less than 1 per cent from last year, while there was a drop of 3 per cent in the Western Provinces and of \& per cert in the Naritime 1 rovinces and uebec, combined. Wholesale sales of fruits and vegetables for the year to date were 6.5 per cent below the sales volune for the corresponding seven months of 1946 .

Wholesale grocers' inventories were valued 31 per cent higher at the end of July this year compared with July 31, 1946 and were 4 per cent higher in value than at the end of June, 1947. Invontories at the beginning of $J_{\text {uly }}$ are normally 7 por cent in excess of sales during that month. Stocks in the hands of wholesale procers at the beginuins of July this year wore valued 9 per cent below the sales volume for that month.

## Retail Trade

Chain Stores - July, 1947 sales of $88 \%$ chain store units operated by 26 chain companies in the foot retailing field were 25 per cent highor than sales of 883 stores operated by the sane 26 firms in July, 1946. Average sales per store in July, 1947 were ${ }_{3} 424,639$, 25 per cent above the $\% 19,651$ average for the sane month of the previous year.

Quebec cxperienced the largest gain in chain food store sales. An incroase of 29 per cent in that province was closely followed by an advance of 28 per cent in ontario. Gains rangine, from 17 to 19 per cont occurred in the Maritine Frovinces, Prairie Frovinces and British Columbia.

Independent Stores - Independent food stores did 6 per cent more business in July this year than last. Sales in the Maritime provinces and Saskatchewan were practically unchanged from last year, while all other regions reportod gains which were close to the average increase for the country as a whole.
