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## NONTHLY FRNANGING OF HOTOR TEHTCLE SALES IN CANADA, JULY, 1939

Financing of motor vehicle sales during July, numbered 15,693 unite with a financed value of $\$ 6,061,155$, recording declines of 3 per cont in number and 6 per cent in amount of financing below the 16,204 vehicles financed for $\$ 6,468,384$ in the same month last yoar. This was the third consecutive month in which sales have been within 5 per cent of the total for the corresponding month of 1938. Cumulative totale for the first seven months show 95,710 new and used motor vehicles financed for $\$ 39,556,816$, declines of 10 per cent in number and 15 per cent in amount of financing below the 106,795 vehicles financed for the extent of $\$ 46,397,7 \%$ in the same period of last year.

New motor vehicle financing during July was lower than in July, 1938, by 13 per cont in number and 12 per cent in amount. There were 3,128 new vehicles financed for $\$ 2,391,448$ in July, 1938, compared with 3,605 vehicles financed for $\$ 2,719,524$ last year. With the exception of Alberta, where an advance of 3 per cent was recorded, declines were prevalent throughout the various economic divisions for which figures are available. In Manitoba and Saskatchewan combined, the decline was 9 per cent, in the Maritime Provinces, 11 per cent, in Quebec, 13 per cent, in Britioh Columbia, 14 per cent and in Ontario, 19 per cont.

Although used vehicle financing showed a fractional decline from July, 1938, for the country as whole, increases were recorded in four of the sixeconomic divisions. The decline of 8 per cent in Ontario was the principal factor in the decline for the Dominion, while British Columbia also showed a decrease of 2 per cent. Increases recorded in the other divisions were as follows: Manitoba and Saskatchewan combined, 18 per cent; Alberta, 16 per cent; the Maritime Provinces, 6 per cent. h fractional inorease occurred in used vohicle financing in the province of quebec.
