## STATISTICS OF AUTOMOBILE FeNCING

The Dominion Bureau of Statistics has recently assembled, as a by-product of its annual report on the automobile industry, data showing the extent of automobile financing in Canada by Finance Companies. This information is a business "barometer" of considerable importance. The figures go back to September 1929 with comparable data for the corresponding month of the previous year. It is not claimed that the reties are entirely comprehensive, but they are sufficiently complete to be highly significant, and more complete returns $w^{\perp} 11$ become available in time.

Each of the last four months of 1929 showed increased financing over the corresponding month of 1928. Preliminary figures for January 1930 are above those for January 1929. In January 1930, 4,715 cars were financed against 3,713 in 1929, and values increased, from $\$ 2,074,161$ to $\$ 2,310,025$. New car financing dropped from 1,448 to 1,214 while financing for used cars increased from 2,325 to 3,501 cars. This tendency is, of course, largely seasonal.
