FINANCING OF MOTOR VEHICLE SALES

### JULY, 1948

Financing of motor vehicle sales in July totalled 14,439 units with a financed value of \$13,402,600. There were 4,377 new vehicles financed, while the number of used vehicles totalled 10,062. Increases over July, 1947 amounted to 10% for new and 42% for used vehicles. There were slight reductions in July compared with June of this year for both new and used vehicles financed.

#### New Vehicles

Passenger car financing was down 3% while commercial vehicles recorded an increase of 30% over July of last year. There were 2,349 passenger models financed in July this year compared with 2,432 in July, 1947. The number of commercial vehicles financed was 2,028 units in July, 1948 and 1,564 last year.

#### Used Vehicles

In the used vehicle field the July increase for passenger cars was 47%, while for trucks and buses the gain was 22% compared with the same month of 1947. Used passenger cars financed numbered 8,272, while the total of used commercial vehicles financed was 1,790 in July of this year.
