## MCNTHLY RETAIL OLSS IN SOUNTRY GNRAL STORES, JANUARY, 1938 (Vaiue of Turnover in Comparison with Frevious Year)

Country general store sales averased one per cent higher in January, 1930, than in the corresponding month a year ago according to monthly statements received from almost 700 of these general merchandise stores located in the smaller towns and rurai areas. quebec and iuanitoba reported better than averase increases; sales in untario and Daskatchewan were down from a year ago, while results for the daritines, Alberta and British Columbia vere similar to that for the Dominion as a whole.

Quebec reported 7 per cent more business than in January of last year, the gain for the southern part of the province being especially good at iv per cent. Sales in Manitoba vere up 4 per cent. Eastern Untario also made a good showing with a gain of 8 per cent but this was offset by declines of 6 per cent in the western and the northern parts, resulting in a net decrease of 2 per cent for the province. Saskatchewan sales were down by 3 per cent.

These percentage chanses in sales are oased upon calendar-month totals with no allowances made for differences in number of business days or for the varying sales importance of different days of the week.
