## MONTHLY INDEXES OF COUNTRY GENERAL STORE SALES

## OCTOBER, 1943

Country general store sales averaged 5 per cent higher in October this year than last according to reports received from approximately 580 of these general merchandise stores located in the smaller towns and rural areas. Gains ranging from one per cent for Manitoba to 12 per cent for the Maritime Provinces were reported by all regions of the country except the southern part of Saskatchewan where a decline of ll per cent was recorded. This decrease was offset by an increase in the northern section, resulting in no change for the province as a whole. Sales in British Columbia increased by 2 per cent; Alberta, 4 per cent; Quebec, 6 per cent; and Ontario, 8 per cent.

Allowing for the difference in number and sales importance of the business days of October this year and last and for normal seasonal movements, sales in October this year were up by 9 per cent over October a year ago and increased by 6 per cent over September of this year. There was the same number of business days in September this year as last.
