## MONTHLY INDEXFS OF COUNTRY GENERAL STORE SALES February. 1944

An average increase of 12 per cent in country general store sales was registered in February this year compared with February a year ago according to reports recelved from approximately 570 of these general merchandise stores located in the smaller towns and rural areas. All regions of the country reported gains rangine from 4 per cent for Manitoba and northern Alberta to 21 per cent for southern Saskatchewan. Sales in Ontario and filberta increased by 8 per cent; British Columbia, 12 per cent; Quebee, 13 per cent; Seskatchowan, 15 per cent and the Maritime Provinces, 18 per cent.

Allowing for the difference in number and sales importance of the business days of February this year and last a ud also for normal seasonal movements, sules in February were up by 8 per cent over February a year ago and increased by 2 per cent over last month. There was one more business day in February this year than lest.
