



AgriCompetitiveness

The AgriCompetitiveness program under the **Canadian Agricultural Partnership** is a five-year (2018-2023), up to **\$20.5 M** federal initiative to support sector-led activities that identify industry best practices and build the capacity of the sector, advance farm business management, farm safety information and tools, as well as activities which raise agricultural awareness.







DETAILS

The program provides non-repayable contributions to projects that focus on one or more of the following priorities:

- building skills, knowledge, and best practices among industry members
- helping the sector build leadership and facilitate knowledge transfer
- increasing business management and planning capacity within the sector
- promoting farm safety
- increasing public trust

FUNDING

Applicants may apply for funding up to 50 per cent of total eligible costs, to a maximum of \$1 million per year and up to a maximum of \$5 million over five years.

Total government funding (including federal, provincial, territorial and municipal governments or their agencies) will not exceed 85 per cent of total eligible costs.



WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

Eligible applicants include not-for-profit:

- · industry associations
- Indigenous groups

Associations should operate on a national basis. Consideration may be given to regional not-for-profit associations if there is no representation at the national level, and the applicant can demonstrate the ability to deliver a project that is national, and/or agriculture and agri-food sector wide in scope.

Commodity organizations, academic institutions, for-profit organizations, and individuals are not eligible to receive funding under this program.

APPLICATION PROCESS

AFTER YOU APPLY, a full review and assessment of your application against the principles and criteria of the program will be carried out.

TIMELINE

Applications are being accepted on a continuous basis until **September 30, 2022**, or until funding has been fully committed.
