

Their presentation included updates on Tariff Rate Quota fill rates for poultry and eggs,

the new allocation policies for chicken and turkey, as well as policy updates related to COVID-19, and trade agreements. Council members also reviewed the amendment to the Canadian Chicken Marketing Quota Regulations for Chicken Farmers of Canada's (CFC) control period A-167, on both

November 13 and 19. At the first meeting, Council postponed its decision to provide CFC

time to revise and update its rationale for A-167 and for the Canadian Poultry and Egg Processors Council to supply more information. After a thorough review of all the information provided, Council approved the A-167 allocation at its November 19, 2020, meeting. In marking these decisions, FPCC was mindful of its role to ensure that the governance and regulatory framework were followed in order to promote a strong, efficient and competitive production and marketing industry. December 15 and 16, 2020 On December 15, 2020, members met the EFC Chair, Roger Pelissero, other members of

the Executive Committee and staff for the EFC annual meeting with Council. The session



was an opportunity to have informal discussions on the Agency's accomplishments and the egg industry's critical issues during these uncertain times.

On December 16, 2020, members considered and approved the following: The amendments to the Canadian Egg Marketing Levies Order set the effective dates of the Levies Order from February 21, 2021, to March 26, 2022, and increased the levy to the Unrestricted Pooled Income Fund by \$0.05 per dozen. The levies collected through the

The proposed amendments to the four schedules of the Canadian Egg Marketing Agency Quota Regulations, 1986 (Federal Quota, Eggs for Processing Quota, Special Temporary Market Requirement Quota and the Vaccine Quota) to extend their expiry dates from

Agency's other three funds (Restricted Research, Unrestricted Administration, and

Restricted Risk Management) were maintained at current levels.

Changes to the fees, travel and living expenses to be paid to members of EFC. After discussion, Council members approved the proposed increases of an additional one day per month per diem for meeting preparation for Directors, the increase in the Chair's honorarium, a full per diem for virtual meetings and conference calls and the increase in mobile device reimbursement.

FPCC's next meeting will be held virtually on January 12, 2021. Council members will host

December 27, 2020, to December 25, 2021. There were no other changes proposed in these

CFC's Executive Committee and staff for this annual meeting. This is an occasion for the Chicken Agency to update members on market conditions, current challenges and upcoming Strategic Plan priorities.



The launch was attended by members from the Pork Council of Canada who are working to put in place the very first Pork Promotion and Research Agency. We had the privilege to





APMA Update On December 4, 2020, the Governor General approved the Order in Council amending the British Columbia Vegetable Order under the Agricultural Products Marketing Act

(APMA). This is the first of 90 delegation orders to have completed the regulatory process



under the APMA Modernization Project in which FPCC is collaborating with Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada.

The principal change is that future amendments to levies orders under this Delegation Order (for example, to change levy amounts) can be made at the provincial level, since the requirement to undertake the federal regulatory process has been removed as part of the
