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Introduction

The <u>Survey on the Importance of Wildlife to Canadians During 1991</u> was carried out by Statistics Canada under the sponsorship of federal and provincial wildlife agencies and the direction of a Federal-Provincial Task Force representing these agencies. The major objective of the survey was to collect basic, accurate and reliable socio-economic information on the importance of wildlife to Canadians to meet Sustainable Development management needs. The survey included questions on the nature and extent of participation in wildlife-related activities, levels of commitment of time and money to these activities and public support for wildlife conservation.

The 1991 survey was designed to update and enhance information collected by Statistics Canada for the years 1981 and 1987 under similar sponsorship arrangements. These three comprehensive data bases are intended to provide strategic socio-economic insights into a wide range of wildlife and habitat policy and program management needs at provincial, federal and international levels.

This report is the first in a new series for the 1991 survey results under the generic title <u>The Importance of Wildlife to Canadians</u>. It consists of detailed data tables which were prepared based on a Tabulation Plan developed by the Federal-Provincial Task Force. The tables are intended primarily for the use of the agencies sponsoring the survey. The Task Force will oversee the publication of reports for more general distribution which will highlight information from the tables and from further analyses.

Structure of the Report

A detailed list of tables precedes sections A to E of the report. Each table includes reference to the corresponding question number on the survey questionnaire.

The tables in <u>Section A1</u> provide information on rates of participation in the wildlife-related activities covered by the survey, such as wildlife viewing and hunting. Profiles of participants by sex, age, rural-urban residence, education and personal income are included in Section A2.

<u>Section B</u> summarizes attitudes toward wildlife and its conservation, and interest in participating in wildlife-related activities. The number of days spent by participants is covered in <u>Section C</u>.

The tables in <u>Section D</u> focus on total and average expenditures by participants in a number of wildlife-related activities. Expenditures for hunting and for primary nonconsumptive trips are further broken down by type of expenditure, such as transportation or equipment. This section also includes information on the amounts participants stated they were willing to pay over and above their actual expenditures before deciding not to participate (consumer surplus). Section D concludes with tables on estimated trap replacement costs.

<u>Section E</u> covers a segmentation of the population by type of activity in order to highlight the **combinations** of activities that were most popular or accounted for large commitments of time and money. Tables E1-E12 cover wildlife-related activities only, while Tables E13-E20 cover both **fish and wildlife**-related activities.

Definitions of terms used in the tables are included in <u>Appendix 1</u>. The survey questionnaire, guidelines for releasing the results, and a list of Federal-Provincial Task Force members are included in Appendices 2 to 4.

Methodology of the Survey

The multistage probability sample used was representative of the entire Canadian population 15 years of age or over in the 10 provinces. The survey questionnaire was prepared and pretested with consultation among all survey sponsors. Statistics Canada used similar key questions in the 1991 survey as in the 1981 and 1987 surveys to provide comparability between the results.

The mail-out/mail-back questionnaire (see Appendix 2) was delivered to 103,398 individuals in February 1992. Respondents were asked to answer questions regarding their activities during 1991. Statistics Canada interviewers conducted telephone followups to encourage respondents to complete and return the questionnaire. To ensure a good response rate, interviewers administered the questionnaire over the telephone to approximately 5 percent of respondents. With this combined mail and telephone survey, a total of 73,521 questionnaires (71.1 percent) were completed. After edits to ensure a minimum amount of questions had been answered and to eliminate duplicate responses, the number of useable questionnaires was 72,410 (70.0 percent). The final response rate by province was as follows:

Data processing of completed questionnaires included data capture under strict quality control procedures, weighting of sample results to obtain corresponding population estimates, an exhaustive computer edit for data quality and completeness, and a procedure to link demographic data on respondents held by Statistics Canada to their responses to the Survey on the Importance of Wildlife to Canadians. Survey estimates were imputed for non-response to individual questions in order to more closely represent the magnitude of amounts such as days and dollars spent on wildlife-related activities.

Full details of the methodology of the survey will be available in a User's Guide to be prepared by Statistics Canada and the Canadian Wildlife Service. This guide will be provided to survey sponsors and other users of the results.

Guidelines for Release of Survey Results

Users of the tables will note that each table is labelled "For Internal Use of Survey Sponsors Only." Statistics Canada requests that sponsors not release estimates whose variability exceeds certain norms. Measures of statistical reliability of a large number of survey estimates have been calculated by Statistics Canada and are included in Appendix 3 of this report, together with release criteria. Users of the tables are asked to assess the releasibility of estimates following the guidelines in Appendix 3 before making them publicly available.

Members of the Federal-Provincial Task Force on the Importance of Wildlife to Canadians have been actively involved in the conduct of the 1991 survey, and are available to answer questions about this report and the release of survey results (see contact list in Appendix 4). SURVEY ON THE IMPORTANCE OF WILDLIFE TO CANADIANS DURING 1991

PRELIMINARY HIGHLIGHTS FOR MANITOBA

A new federal-provincial cooperative survey on the importance of wildlife to Canadians confirms the popularity of wildlife-related activities among residents of Manitoba. Significant benefits to the Manitoba economy result from spending on these activities. The public remains strongly committed to the protection and conservation of abundant and diverse wildlife. Key findings from the survey, conducted by Statistics Canada among approximately 6,900 residents 15 years of age and over, are summarized below.

Wildlife-related Activities in 1991

In 1991, 755 thousand residents of Manitoba (93 percent of the population) took part in one or more wildlife-related activities, devoting a total of 49.7 million days of their time and \$159 million of their money to these activities. Such spending contributed significantly to the Manitoba economy in the form of income and jobs.

- * Over 619 thousand residents (76 percent of the population) watched, photographed, studied or fed wildlife around their homes or on trips and spent \$83.9 million on these activities. The 152 thousand (19 percent) who took primary nonconsumptive trips to see wildlife spent an average of 19 days and \$417 on these trips. In total, they spent over \$63 million during the year on trip-related expenses and on equipment for wildlife viewing.
- * There were over 66 thousand <u>hunters</u> in 1991, 8.3 percent of the population. About 16 percent of the population (135 thousand) expressed at least some interest in hunting. Hunters spent an average of 14 days and \$663. In total, they spent \$44.3 million on food, lodging, transportation, equipment and other expenses related to hunting.
- * In 1991, 77.7 thousand (9.6 percent of the population) joined or contributed to wildlife organizations. They spent an estimated \$5.5 million or \$71 each during the year to support the work of these organizations.
- * About 87 percent of Manitoba residents feel it is <u>important to maintain abundant</u> wildlife. Similar high levels of support occurred for the maintenance of abundant populations of waterfowl, other birds, small mammals and large mammals. Over 62 percent were <u>willing to pay increased taxes or prices</u> if this is needed to conserve the wetlands, forests and other habitats on which wildlife depends.
- * Strong support for measures to ensure the diversity of wildlife was confirmed, with over 83 percent stating it is very or fairly important to protect endangered or declining wildlife populations. Further, more than 53 percent of residents would be willing to make financial sacrifices if this were required to help protect wildlife from the effects of air pollution, acid rain, oil spills or pesticide use.

Recreational Fishing in 1991

The survey also covered <u>recreational fishing</u> in Manitoba. There were over 228 thousand anglers in 1991, 28 percent of the population. They spent an average of 13 days and \$446 on this activity. Anglers spent an estimated \$101.9 million in total trip-related expenses and equipment.

When fishing expenditures are added to those for wildlife-related activities, the \$260.5 million total represents a significant outlay by the residents of Manitoba which has important impacts at local and provincial levels of the economy. These impacts will be examined in a forthcoming report.

Cross-border Wildlife Tourism in 1991

The survey also questioned residents of Manitoba on fish and wildlife-related trips taken to the United States. The results show that among residents who took primary nonconsumptive trips to see wildlife, 7 percent took such trips to the United States. In addition, 3 percent of anglers reported having pursued fishing activities in the U.S. during 1991. Altogether, residents of Manitoba spent an estimated \$3.2 million during fish and wildlife-related trips to the U.S.

Trends Since 1987

A comparison of results of the 1991 Survey on the Importance of Wildlife to Canadians with those from a similar study in 1987 show that residents of Manitoba remain committed to wildlife-related activities. <u>Total participants</u> was up from 92 percent of the population in 1987 to the current level of 93 percent. <u>Total expenditures</u> on wildlife-related activities decreased from \$195 million in 1987 to \$158 million in 1991.

Certain activities showed increases in participation. The proportion of residents who joined or contributed to wildlife organizations went up 1.5 percentage points to a current level of 9.6 percent of the population, and the proportion who maintained natural areas for wildlife went up 1 percentage point to a current level of 4.9 percent. The proportion participating in residential activities increased by 2.2 percentage points to a current level of 71 percent. Involvement in indirect wildlife-related activities such as watching wildlife TV programs, was up 1 percentage point to a current level of 89 percent.

Other activities retained similar levels of participation. Participation in recreational fishing remained stable in 1991 since 1987 at 28 percent of the population.

<u>Certain activities showed decreases in participation</u>. Participation in primary nonconsumptive trips has declined 2.8 percentage points to its current level of 19 percent of the population.

Hunting declined slightly by 1 percentage point to its 1991 level of 8.3 percent of the population.

<u>Public support for wildlife conservation increased</u>. In 1991, over 61 percent of Manitoba residents stated that maintaining abundant wildlife populations is very important, a large increase of 11.6 percentage points since 1987. A further 25 percent stated that it is fairly important. Overall, the proportion of residents stating it is very or fairly important to maintain abundant wildlife (87 percent) increased by 2.8 percentage points since 1987. The public also remained committed to the preservation of declining or endangered wildlife populations, with 84 percent stating it is very or fairly important to them, compared to 86 percent in 1987.

Methodology

The Survey of the Importance of Wildlife to Canadians During 1991 was carried out by Statistics Canada on behalf of federal and provincial wildlife agencies. A representative sample of 6,955 residents of Manitoba 15 years of age or over were contacted for the survey between January and May, 1992, with a response rate of 70 percent. A comprehensive perspective on national and provincial survey results will be provided in a series of reports prepared by a Federal-Provincial Task Force of survey sponsors and published by the Canadian Wildlife Service, Environment Canada. The findings presented in these preliminary highlights may be revised as a result of ongoing statistical analyses.

SURVEY ON THE IMPORTANCE OF WILDLIFE TO CANADIANS DURING 1991

PRELIMINARY HIGHLIGHTS FOR ALBERTA

A new federal-provincial cooperative survey on the importance of wildlife to Canadians confirms the popularity of wildlife-related activities among Albertans. Significant benefits to the Albertan economy result from spending on these activities. The public remains strongly committed to the protection and conservation of abundant and diverse wildlife. Key findings from the survey, conducted by Statistics Canada among approximately 9,200 Albertans 15 years of age and over, are summarized below.

Wildlife-related Activities in 1991

In 1991, 1.8 million Albertans (95 percent of the population) took part in one or more wildlife-related activities, devoting a total of 134 million days of their time and \$835 million of their money to these activities. Such spending contributed significantly to the Albertan economy in the form of income and jobs.

- * Over 1.5 million Albertans (80 percent of the population) watched, photographed, studied or fed wildlife around their homes or on trips and spent nearly \$491 million on these activities. The 383 thousand (20 percent) who took primary nonconsumptive trips to see wildlife spent an average of 24 days and \$1,126 on these trips. In total, they spent over \$431 million during the year on trip-related expenses and on equipment for wildlife viewing.
- * There were about 134 thousand <u>hunters</u> in 1991, 7.1 percent of the population. Over 17 percent of the population (340 thousand) expressed at least some interest in participating. Hunters spent an average of 16 days and \$1,165. In total, they spent \$156 million on food, lodging, transportation, equipment and other expenses related to hunting.
- * In 1991, 179 thousand (9.5 percent of the population) joined or contributed to wildlife organizations. They spent an estimated \$20.6 million or \$115 each during the year to support the work of these organizations.
- * Over 89 percent of Albertans feel it is <u>important to maintain abundant wildlife</u>. Similar high levels of support occurred for the maintenance of abundant populations of waterfowl, other birds, small mammals and large mammals. Over 70 percent were <u>willing to pay increased taxes or prices</u> if this is needed to conserve the wetlands, forests and other habitats on which wildlife depends.
- * Strong support for measures to ensure the diversity of wildlife was confirmed, with over 87 percent stating it is very or fairly important to protect endangered or declining wildlife populations. Further, more than 61 percent of Albertans would be willing to make financial sacrifices if this were required to help protect wildlife from the effects of air pollution, acid rain, oil spills or pesticide use.

Recreational Fishing in 1991

The survey also covered <u>recreational fishing</u> in Alberta. There were over 475 thousand anglers in 1991, 25 percent of the population. They spent an average of 12 days and \$683 on this activity. Anglers spent an estimated \$324.6 million in total trip-related expenses and equipment.

When fishing expenditures are added to those for wildlife-related activities, the \$1.2 billion total represents a significant outlay by Albertans which has important impacts at local and provincial levels of the economy. These impacts will be examined in a forthcoming report.

Cross-border Wildlife Tourism in 1991

The survey also questioned Albertans on <u>fish and wildlife-related trips taken to the United States</u>. The results show that among Albertans who took primary nonconsumptive trips to see wildlife, 6 percent took such trips to the United States. In addition, 5 percent of Albertan anglers reported having pursued fishing activities in the U.S. during 1991. Altogether, Albertans spent an estimated \$13.7 million during fish and wildlife-related trips to the U.S.

Trends Since 1987

A comparison of results of the 1991 Survey on the Importance of Wildlife to Canadians with those from a similar study in 1987 show that Albertans remain committed to wildlife-related activities. Total participants stayed relatively stable at about 95 percent of the population. Total expenditures on wildlife-related activities increased from \$661 million in 1987 to \$835 million in 1991.

Certain activities showed increases in participation. The proportion of Albertans who joined or contributed to wildlife organizations went up 1 percentage point to a current level of 9.5 percent of the population, and the proportion who maintained natural areas for wildlife went up 2 percentage points to a current level of 6.1 percent. The proportion participating in residential activities increased by 4.5 percentage points to a current level of 72.5 percent.

Other activities retained similar levels of participation. Involvement in indirect wildlife-related activities such as watching wildlife TV programs, remained relatively stable in 1991 since 1987 at 91 percent of the population.

<u>Certain activities showed decreases in participation</u>. Participation in primary nonconsumptive trips has declined 2.3 percentage points to its current level of 20 percent of the population. Hunting declined by 3.1 percentage points to its 1991 level of 7.1 percent of the population. Recreational fishing declined by 6 percentage points to its current level of 25 percent.

Public support for wildlife conservation increased. In 1991, over 68 percent of Albertans stated that maintaining abundant wildlife populations is very important, a large increase of 14.6 percentage points since 1987. A further 21 percent stated that it is fairly important. Overall, the proportion of Albertans stating it is very or fairly important to maintain abundant wildlife (over 89 percent) was up about 2 percentage points from 1987. The public also remained strongly committed to the preservation of declining or endangered wildlife populations, with 87 percent stating it is very or fairly important to them, compared to 89 percent in 1987.

The Survey of the Importance of Wildlife to Canadians During 1991 was carried out by Statistics Canada on behalf of federal and provincial wildlife agencies. A representative sample of 9,267 Albertans 15 years of age or over were contacted for the survey between January and May, 1992, with a response rate of 70.9 percent. A comprehensive perspective on national and provincial survey results will be provided in a series of reports prepared by a Federal-Provincial Task Force of survey sponsors and published by the Canadian Wildlife Service, Environment Canada. The findings presented in these preliminary highlights may be revised as a result of ongoing statistical analyses.

SURVEY ON THE IMPORTANCE OF WILDLIFE TO CANADIANS DURING 1991

PRELIMINARY HIGHLIGHTS FOR SASKATCHEWAN

A new federal-provincial cooperative survey on the importance of wildlife to Canadians confirms the popularity of wildlife-related activities among residents of Saskatchewan. Significant benefits to the Saskatchewan economy result from spending on these activities. The public remains strongly committed to the protection and conservation of abundant and diverse wildlife. Key findings from the survey, conducted by Statistics Canada among approximately 7,500 residents 15 years of age and over, are summarized below.

Wildlife-related Activities in 1991

In 1991, 655 thousand residents of Saskatchewan (91 percent of the population) took part in one or more wildlife-related activities, devoting a total of 41.3 million days of their time and \$173 million of their money to these activities. Such spending contributed significantly to the Saskatchewan economy in the form of income and jobs.

- * Over 536 thousand residents (75 percent of the population) watched, photographed, studied or fed wildlife around their homes or on trips and spent nearly \$92.3 million on these activities. The 117 thousand (16 percent) who took primary nonconsumptive trips to see wildlife spent an average of 20 days and \$654 on these trips. In total, they spent over \$77 million during the year on trip-related expenses and on equipment for wildlife viewing.
- * There were about 74 thousand <u>hunters</u> in 1991, 10.3 percent of the population. Over 21 percent of the population (160 thousand) expressed at least some interest in hunting. Hunters spent an average of 12 days and \$660. In total, they spent \$49.1 million on food, lodging, transportation, equipment and other expenses related to hunting.
- * In 1991, 84.4 thousand (11.7 percent of the population) joined or contributed to wildlife organizations. They spent an estimated \$4.8 million or \$57 each during the year to support the work of these organizations.
- * Almost 87 percent of Saskatchewan residents feel it is <u>important to maintain abundant wildlife</u>. Similar high levels of support occurred for the maintenance of abundant populations of waterfowl, other birds, small mammals and large mammals. Over 60 percent were <u>willing to pay increased taxes or prices</u> if this is needed to conserve the wetlands, forests and other habitats on which wildlife depends.
- * Strong support for measures to ensure the diversity of wildlife was confirmed, with over 82 percent stating it is very or fairly important to protect endangered or declining wildlife populations. Further, 52 percent of residents would be willing to make financial sacrifices if this were required to help protect wildlife from the effects of air pollution, acid rain, oil spills or pesticide use.

Recreational Fishing in 1991

The survey also covered <u>recreational fishing</u> in Saskatchewan. There were over 239 thousand anglers in 1991, 33 percent of the population. They spent an average of 12 days and \$637 on this activity. Anglers spent an estimated \$152.5 million in total trip-related expenses and equipment.

When fishing expenditures are added to those for wildlife-related activities, the \$325.5 million total represents a significant outlay by the residents of Saskatchewan which has important impacts at local and provincial levels of the economy. These impacts will be examined in a forthcoming report.

Cross-border Wildlife Tourism in 1991

The survey also questioned residents of Saskatchewan on fish and wildlife-related trips taken to the United States. The results show that among residents who took primary nonconsumptive trips to see wildlife, 6.0 percent took such trips to the United States. In addition, 2.0 percent of anglers reported having pursued fishing activities in the U.S. during 1991. Altogether, residents of Saskatchewan spent an estimated \$2.5 million during fish and wildlife-related trips to the U.S.

Trends Since 1987

A comparison of results of the 1991 Survey on the Importance of Wildlife to Canadians with those from a similar study in 1987 show that residents of Saskatchewan remain committed to wildlife-related activities. <u>Total participants</u> was up from 90.4 percent of the population in 1987 to the current level of 92 percent. <u>Total expenditures</u> on wildlife-related activities decreased by nearly 30 percent from \$224 million in 1987 to \$173 million in 1991.

Certain activities showed increases in participation. The proportion of residents who joined or contributed to wildlife organizations went up 2.9 percentage points to a current level of 11.7 percent of the population, and the proportion who maintained natural areas for wildlife went up 1.5 percentage points to a current level of 5.6 percent. The proportion participating in residential activities increased by 3.3 percentage points to a current level of 69 percent. Involvement in indirect wildlife-related activities such as watching wildlife TV programs, was up 1.5 percentage points to a current level of 86 percent. Participation in recreational fishing increased by 3.5 percentage points to 33 percent of the population.

Other activities retained similar levels of participation. Participation in hunting remained relatively stable in 1991 since 1987 at 10 percent of the population.

<u>Certain activities showed decreases in participation</u>. Participation in primary nonconsumptive trips has declined 2.0 percentage points to its current level of 16 percent of the population.

Public support for wildlife conservation increased. In 1991, over 59 percent of Saskatchewan residents stated that maintaining abundant wildlife populations is very important, a large increase of 14.4 percentage points since 1987. A further 28 percent stated that it is fairly important. Overall, the proportion of residents stating it is very or fairly important to maintain abundant wildlife (87 percent) was higher than the 1987 level of 84 percent. The public also remained committed to the preservation of declining or endangered wildlife populations, with 83 percent stating it is very or fairly important to them, compared to 86 percent in 1987.

The Survey of the Importance of Wildlife to Canadians During 1991 was carried out by Statistics Canada on behalf of federal and provincial wildlife agencies. A representative sample of 7,523 residents of Saskatchewan 15 years of age or over were contacted for the survey between January and May, 1992, with a response rate of 74 percent. A comprehensive perspective on national and provincial survey results will be provided in a series of reports prepared by a Federal-Provincial Task Force of survey sponsors and published by the Canadian Wildlife Service, Environment Canada. The findings presented in these preliminary highlights may be revised as a result of ongoing statistical analyses.

Appendix 3: Guidelines for Releasing Survey Data

Before releasing and/or publishing any estimates from the data tables, users should determine whether the estimate can be released based on the following guidelines.

The releasability of an estimate is governed by the coefficient of variation (CV) of the estimate. There are two types of estimates in the Survey on the Importance of Wildlife to Canadians, qualitative (e.g. participation in an activity) and quantitative (e.g. number of days spent on an activity).

The table titled "Approximate Sampling Variability Tables for Survey on the Importance of Wildlife to Canadians" should be consulted to determine the coefficient of variation (CV) for qualitative estimates. These include all estimates of the <u>population</u>, <u>subpopulations</u>, and <u>number of participants</u> in the tables in Sections A-E. The table titled "Exact Sampling Variability Table for Selected Estimates from the Survey on the Importance of Wildlife to Canadians" should be used to determine CV's for quantitative estimates. These include estimates of <u>days</u> and <u>dollars</u> in Tables C1-C17, D1-D25, and E8, E9, E11, E12, E16, E17, E19 and E20.

Once the CV has been determined, users should assess the releasibility of the estimate by consulting the Statistics Canada release policy in the following chart.

Coefficient of Variation (in %)	Statistics Canada Release Policy	
0.0 to 16.5	Unqualified Release	Estimates can be considered for general unrestricted release. No special notation is required.
16.6 to 25.0	Qualified Release	Estimates can be considered for general unrestricted release but should be accompanied by a warning cautioning users of the high sampling variability associated with the estimates. such estimates should be identified by the letter Q (or in some other similar fashion).
25.1 to 33.3	Restricted Release	Estimates can be considered for general unrestricted release only when sampling variabilities are obtained using an exact variance calculation procedure, the estimates should be accompanied by a warning of high sampling variability associated with the estimates.
33.4 or over	Not for Release	Estimates should not be released in any form under any circumstances. In such statistical tables, such estimates should be deleted.
