This is one of eight Background Studies that form part of the evaluation of the Special Program of Cultural Initiatives (SPCI).

The study was conducted by Canadian Facts for the Program Evaluation Division of the Department of Communications, Canada. The views expressed herein are those of the author and do not necessarily represent the views or policies of the Department of Communications.

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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Background Study No. 4 to the Evaluation of the Special Program of Cultural Initiatives (SPCI) provides information on the impacts and effects of the program on members of the general public in 31 selected communities across Canada. The study consisted of 1,601 telephone interviews, approximately 50 per community, with a randomly selected sample of individuals 18 years of age and over. The majority of the interviews were conducted from Canadian Facts CLT (Central Location Telephone) interviewing facilities during the first three weeks of December, 1983. The remainder were conducted during the first week of January, 1984.

The survey provides information on public:

- Perception of the adequacy of community cultural facilities and programs;
- Utilization of cultural organizations and institutions;
- Membership in cultural organization(s) and cultural time use;
- Knowledge of cultural events and policies;

SOMMAIRE-RECOMMANDATION

La quatrième étude préliminaire de l'évaluation du Programme spécial d'initiatives culturelles (PSIC) fait état des répercussions et incidences du Programme sur la population de 31 collectivités choisies au Canada. L'étude a donné lieu à 1 601 entrevues téléphoniques, soit une cinquantaine par collectivité, auprès d'un échantillonnage de personnes âgées de 18 ans et plus. La plupart des entrevues téléphoniques ont été faites au cours des trois premières semaines de décembre 1983, à partir du téléphone central de la Canadian Facts. Les autres ont eu lieu pendant la première semaine de janvier 1984.

- point de vue des citoyens sur le caractère des installations et programmes culturels de leur communauté;

TECHNICAL REPORT

Background and Purpose

The Special Program of Cultural Initiatives (SPCI) was developed in collaboration with the federal cultural agencies, provincial governments and cultural organizations to provide financial support for a network of performing arts and cultural organizations in Canada. Financing was provided from the Federal Government's share of the provincially administered lotteries. The overall goal of SPCI has been to increase Canadians' access to performing arts and heritage activities. During the period FY 1980/81 through FY 1982/83, \$26 million was provided in grant to:

- Reduce deficits of performing arts organizations on a cost sharing basis with provincial governments and the private sector;
- Strengthen the managerial capacity of performing arts organizations;
- Facilitate capital improvements in performing arts and heritage institutions;
- Assist in the realization of cultural activities of national character or significance;

Evaluation of SPCI

Cabinet requested an evaluation of SPCI to be completed by February 1984. The report of the evaluation will be used to assist in the Federal Government's current development of a multi-faceted cultural policy. The issues addressed in the evaluation are as follows:

1. Program Rationale:

- Are the objectives and mandate of SPCI still relevant?

2. Impacts and Effects:

- Does SPCI complement, duplicate, overlap with or work at cross purposes to other programs?
- What were the impacts and effects (intended and unintended) of SPCI?
- Did SPCI contribute to the development of a national network of suitable facilities?
- Did SPCI provide equality of access to facilities and benefits?
- Did SPCI increase the cultural awareness of Canadians?

3. Alternatives:

- Can the goals of SPCI be achieved by alternative means which may be more cost effective?

4. Objectives Achievement:

- Has SPCI contributed to the viability of individual performing arts organizations?
- Has SPCI, along with other Federal programs and other factors, contributed to the maintenance and extension of a viable network of Canadian performing arts and museum facilities?
- Has SPCI increased and broadened public access to performing arts and heritage activities in communities across Canada?
- Has SPCI contributed to a sense of Canadian identity and cultural awareness, specifically awareness of Canadian talent, and of a sense of the Federal role in the development of Canadian cultural identity?

5. Program Delivery

- How adequate have been the criteria and procedures employed in the administration of SPCI?
- How consistently have the program criteria been applied?
- How expeditiously were applications processed?
- What was the level of program awareness among target populations?

Methodology of the Evaluation

The evaluation involved eight Background Studies including:

- Background Study #1 A review of program delivery for SPCI and assembly of program administrative data;
- Background Study #2 Assembly of existing data for the evaluation study (other than program data) at the community level and at the organizational/institutional level;
- Background Study #3 A telephone survey of a representative sample of Canadian performing arts organizations and heritage organizations;
- Background Study #4 A series of representative Canadian communities;
- Background Study #5 A series of case studies of Canadian performing arts organizations and heritage institutions together with a survey and case studies of umbrella performing arts and heritage associations;
- Background Study #6 A series of case studies of projects of national character or significance;

Background Study #7 Integration of the data bases developed in
Background Studies #1 through #6;

Background Study #8 Analysis of the integrated data base conducted
in Background Study #7.

Background Study No. 4 'Community Survey'

Research Objectives

Background Study No. 4, a telephone survey of members of the general public in 31 communities, was designed to address Issues 2 and 4 as detailed above. The communities selected for inclusion in the survey were those studied in the previous CIPC study "Community Infrastructure and Participation in Culture: A Study of the Effects of the Supply of Cultural Facilities and Resources on Cultural Participation in Thirty-One Canadian Communities", Secretary of State, 1980.

The information required from the survey included:

- Perception of the adequacy of community cultural facilities and programs;
- Utilization of cultural organizations and institutions (attendance, subscription, etc.);

- Membership in cultural organization(s) and cultural time use;
- Knowledge of cultural events and policies;
- Submission to the Federal Cultural Policy Review Committee (Applebaum-Hébert);

A draft questionnaire was provided by DOC and subsequently revised following a pretest of 10 interviews conducted by Canadian Facts.

The Sample

The research specifications called for 1,550 telephone interviews, 50 in each of the 31 communities.

Selection of Telephone Numbers

Four replicates of 50 telephone numbers were selected for each community. For communities with populations of 30,000 and over, listings were prepared using a random digit telephone book plus one method, i.e., that is, listings were selected systematically from telephone directories and the numbers selected were modified by raising the last digit. For communities with populations of under 30,000, telephone listings were selected from telephone directories. Records of Call were prepared for all telephone numbers in Canadian Facts Head Office Sampling Department.

Sample Disposition

Allocation of the subsamples was controlled to ensure that each subsample was exhausted, that is, that no further completions could be obtained before the next was allocated. Up to five calls were made to each telephone number in order to:

- Screen out non-qualifying households (those in which any individual was employed in the media, marketing/opinion research or publishing);
- List all individuals 18 years of age in the household;
- Select a respondent from those listed according to specified procedure;
- Obtain a completed interview;

After making up to 5 calls to each telephone number, interviewers contacted 3,174 households or 69% of all assigned listings. As noted above, non-qualifying households were screened out, and a listing of all household members 18 years of age and over had to be obtained from each qualifying household in order to select a designated respondent. Following these procedures, listings were obtained and potential respondents selected in 2,041 households.

Potential respondents were contacted in 1,968 households, that is, 96% of all households in which an identified respondent was selected. Completed interviews were obtained with 81% of all designated respondents.

As shown in the table following, the results of the sample allocation were fairly uniform across the five regions. The only exception was Quebec in which initial refusals were lower and completions somewhat higher than in the rest of the country.

Data Collection

All interviews were conducted under supervision from Canadian Facts CLT (Central Location Telephone) interviewing facilities in thirteen centres across Canada. Interviewing took place during 5:30 P.M. to 9 P.M. weekdays and 10 a.m. to 4 P.M. Saturdays between December 7, 1983 and December 20, 1983 and January 3, 1984 and January 8, 1984.

Supervisors in the CLTs maintained daily tabulations of sample allocations. Weekly progress reports were sent to the Project Authority.

Copies of the questionnaire are appended.

Response Rates

In general, the survey was apparently well received by the public. Despite the fact that most of the interviewing had to be conducted during the pre-Christmas period, the rate of initial refusal was only marginally higher than for other similar surveys conducted at other times of the year. As noted above, listings were obtained from 64% of all household contacts and 81% of all respondent contacts yielded completed interviews.

Data Limitations

Due to the size and nature of the sample, no attempt should be made to project the results for any single community. Caution also should be exercised in analysis at the regional level.

Quality Controls

The controls used in allocating the sample have been noted above. The results of the interviews were forwarded to Canadian Facts Head Office. All editing, coding, data entry and record cleaning was conducted by Canadian Facts using our standard procedures.


