NAVAL COMMUNICATORS: Be a vital part of tactical operations, providing real-time communication for everyone on the ship:

Operate/monitor cryptographic, computer networks, and satellite systems

Civilian equivalent: Communications Network Specialist

NAVAL COMBAT INFORMATION OPERATORS: Be the eyes and ears of the ship. Work with the most advanced war-fighting equipment. Experts in Information Warfare:

 Operate/control radar and surveillance systems to detect possible threats

Civilian equivalent: Information Systems Specialist

NAVAL ELECTRONIC SENSOR OPERATORS: Be the Navy's expert in Above Water Warfare and air and surface weapons:

- Detect and analyze electronic signals providing warnings of possible threats

Civilian equivalent: Electrical and Electronics Engineer
