## What is the CTCN?

The CTCN is the operational arm of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC). Created by the Cancun agreements in 2010, the CTCN helps accelerate the development and transfer of climate-friendly technologies to help developing countries meet their climate targets and sustainable development goals.

## How does the CTCN work?

The CTCN leverages the expertise of a global network of almost 500 members from industry, finance, civil society and research institutions to provide technical assistance and capacity building to countries in need.

In its five years of operations, the CTCN has undertaken more than 180 technical assistance requests, including feasibility studies and policy, regulatory and financial guidance to accelerate technology piloting and deployment around the world.
