# **QUICK FACTS**

## **The Federal Offender Population Profile 2018**

During the past decade, the offender population profile at Correctional Service of Canada (CSC) institutions has changed significantly. This change has put new pressures on CSC and its operations. CSC continues to manage a more divers and challenging offender population than ever before.

#### **Population size**

As of 2017-18, CSC was responsible for 23,223 federal offenders, 14,092 of whom were in custody (including temporary detainees) and 9,131 who were supervised in the community.

#### **Current offender population profile**

- The median age of the offender population is 42 years old.
- The proportion of Caucasian offenders decreased by four per cent in the last five years.
- The proportion of Indigenous offenders increased by just over 17 per cent in the same time period.
- Indigenous offenders continue to be disproportionately represented in the offender population. Twenty-seven per cent of offenders are of Indigenous ancestry; however, Indigenous Peoples comprise only four percent of the Canadian population.
- Indigenous women are over-represented in the federal correctional system. They represent almost 40 per cent of incarcerated women offenders.
- The majority of offenders identify as Catholic or Protestant; however, this proportion has decreased by just over eight per cent in the last five years.

- Approximately two-thirds of offenders are classified as medium-security risk.
- Approximately six per cent of Canadian federal offenders are women.

#### Length of sentences

- At the end of fiscal year 2017-18, 39 per cent of offenders were serving a sentence of less than four years, with almost 30 per cent serving a sentence between four and 10 years.
- Twenty-four per cent of offenders were serving a life/indeterminate sentence.

#### Meeting challenges

To better respond to the current offender population, CSC has made changes to how it operates by:

- Enhancing intelligence and information systems
- Implementing population management and mental health strategies
- Regularly reviewing and modernizing the delivery of penitentiary operations and rehabilitation programs
