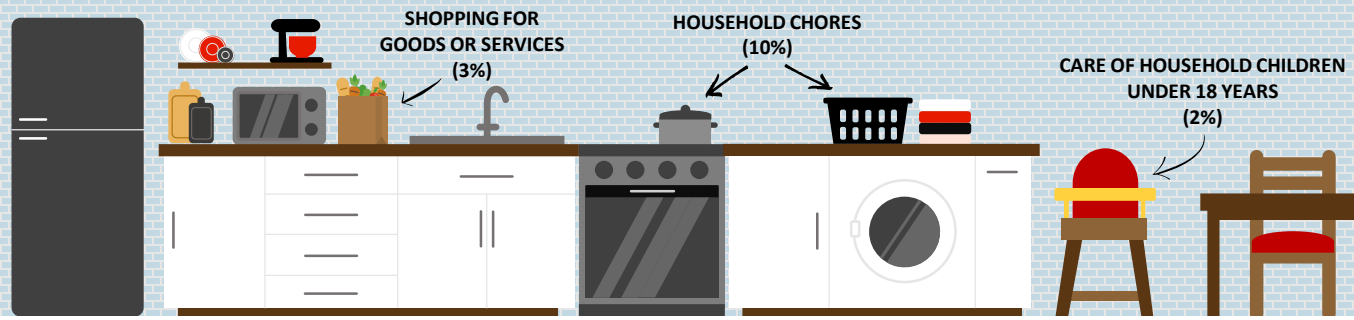

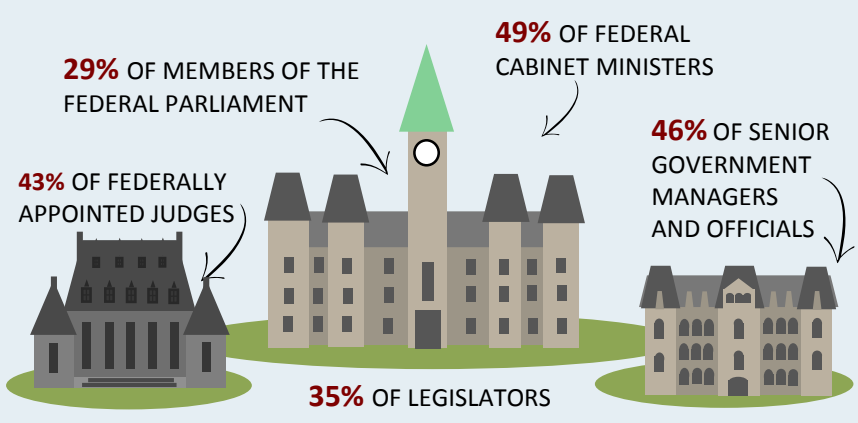
COMMUNITY SPOTLIGHT
