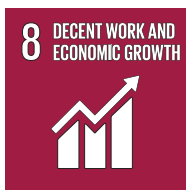
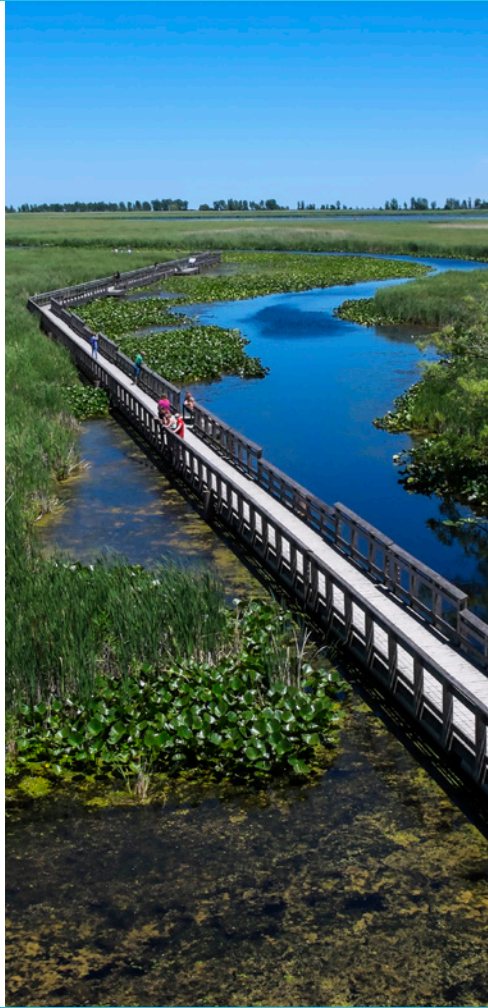
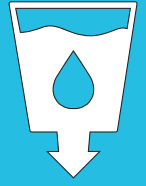

 PER DAY IN 2017

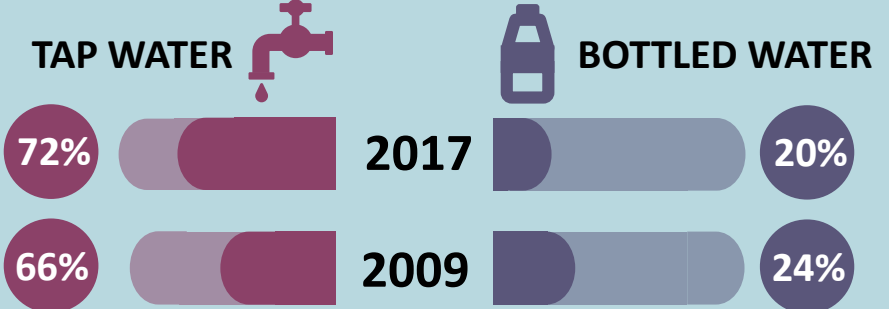

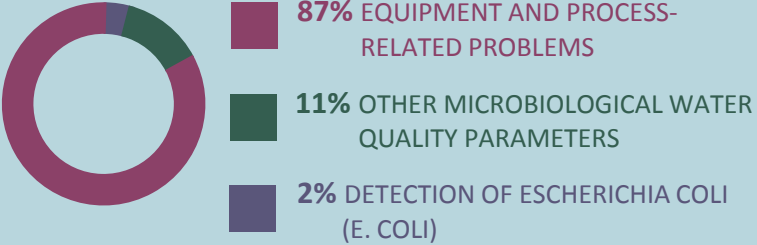
