Deliver evaluation projects that support NRC in the achievement of results, sound stewardship and effective resource management

• 5-year schedule includes majority of all of NRC's direct program spending on a 5-year timeframe – only two enabling services not covered



Provide independent and timely insight, advice and challenge to management on a range of issues including new business models, risks and ongoing business operations

- completion of two program reviews (Bio-based Specialty Chemicals and Health Technologies)
- management of retrospective review of NRC programs
- share common themes from program reviews and evaluations
- develop approaches to monitoring and evaluating collaboration centres and enabling services



Facilitate use in decision-making, improve communication of results to NRC executives and other internal stakeholders

- build expertise in using Slide Docs for evaluation reports and continuing to improve dissemination (i.e., decks) to the Performance Measurement and Evaluation Committee (PMEC)
- implement communication strategy at the function-level and project-level (e.g., presentations to research centre advisory committees, articles in internal NRC newsletter)

EVALUATIONS AND PROGRAM REVIEWS INFORM DECISION-MAKING



100% of NRC respondents agreed that evaluation/ program review recommendations should result in significant improvements to the program



75% of NRC respondents found that evaluations/ program reviews were beneficial to program management



96% of evaluation management action plan items due in 2017-18 were actually implemented – NRC achieved the highest completion rate out of all large-sized Government of Canada departments (Management Accountability Framework 2018-19 Results Management)

STRONG EXPERTISE IN PEER REVIEWS



91% of peer review committee members agreed documentation contained necessary information to answer review questions



91% of peer review committee members would recommend participation to a colleague

- Training on GBA+ and risk: led to the development of approaches piloted in evaluations
- Sharing expertise: multiple outreach within NRC (peer review, performance measurement) and within the Government of Canada evaluation community (walk your data, follow-up on recommendations, neutral assessment)
