

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## Minister's message

On behalf of Environment and Climate Change Canada, I am pleased to present our report on fees for 2020–21.

The Service Fees Act provides a modern legislative framework that enables cost-effective delivery of services and, through better reporting to Parliament, improves transparency and oversight.

Last year's report provided details on each fee, such as the type and rate of adjustment, the service standard and the performance result. This information provided additional context on each fee, in the spirit of open and transparent fee management.



This year's report once again includes factors or events that affected the information in the report, anticipated changes relating to fees, instances when the Department applied section 17 of the *Service Fees Act*, and how many of its fees are subject to the *Low-Materiality Fees Regulations*.

I welcome the increased transparency and oversight that the *Service Fees Act's* reporting regime embodies. I will continue to lead my department's transition to the reporting regime provided under the *Service Fees Act*.

# About this report

This report, which is tabled under section 20 of the *Service Fees Act*<sup>i</sup>, including the *Low-Materiality Fees Regulations*<sup>ii</sup> and subsection 4.2.8 of the *Directive on Charging and Special Financial Authorities*<sup>iii</sup>, contains information about the fees that Environment and Climate Change Canada had the authority to set in 2020–21.<sup>1</sup>

Government of Canada departments may set fees for services, licences, permits, products, the use of facilities, for other authorizations of rights or privileges, or to recover, in whole or in part, costs incurred in relation to a regulatory scheme.

For reporting purposes, fees must be categorized under the following three fee-setting mechanisms:

- 1. Act, regulation or fees notice
  - An act of Parliament delegates the fee-setting authority to a department, minister or Governor in Council.

#### 2. Contract

Ministers have the authority to enter into contracts, which are usually
negotiated between the minister and an individual or organization, and
which cover fees and other terms and conditions. In some cases, that
authority may also be provided by an act of Parliament.

#### 3. Market rate or auction

• The authority to set these fees is pursuant to an act of Parliament or regulation, and the minister, department or Governor in Council has no control over the fee amount.

This report contains information about all fees that are under Environment and Climate Change Canada's authority.

The information covers fees subject to the Service Fees Act.

For fees set by contract, fees set by market-rate, auction or both, the report provides totals only. For fees set by act, regulation or fees notice, it provides totals for fee groupings, as well as detailed information for each fee.

Although the fees that Environment and Climate Change Canada charges under the *Access to Information Act* were subject to the *Service Fees Act*, they are not included in this report. Information on Environment and Climate Change Canada's access to information fees for 2020–21 can be found in our access to information report, which is

## Remissions

This report does not include remissions issued under the authority of the *Service Fees Act*, since this requirement took effect on April 1, 2021. Remissions issued under the *Service Fees Act* will be reported for the first time, as applicable, in the 2021–22 Fees Report, which will be published in 2022–23.

The Service Fees Act requires departments to remit a fee, in part or in full, to a fee payer when a service standard is deemed not met. Under the Service Fees Act and the Directive on Charging and Special Financial Authorities, departments had to develop policies and procedures for determining:

- whether a service standard has been met
- how much of a fee will be remitted to a fee payer if a service standard is deemed not met

Environment and Climate Change Canada's remission policy and procedures was made available to the public on April 1, 2021, and can be found on the following web page: *Departmental Remissions Policy for Service Fees*<sup>v</sup>.

No other remissions related to fees were issued by Environment and Climate Change Canada since it did not have or seek other authorities to remit.

The online Migratory Game Bird Hunting e-Permitting system, which is available on the Environment and Climate Change Canada website, allows hunters to receive their permit by mail no later than August 1 in addition to receiving a PDF of the permit by email with a printed image of a stamp. The stamp is also available in philatelic form for collectors.

#### Performance result

The service standard for this fee was met 99% of the time for the approximately 169,000 stamp applications received. ## About this report

This report, which is tabled under section 20 of the *Service Fees Act*<sup>i</sup>, including the *Low-Materiality Fees Regulations*<sup>ii</sup> and subsection 4.2.8 of the *Directive on Charging and Special Financial Authorities*<sup>iii</sup>, contains information about the fees that Environment and Climate Change Canada had the authority to set in 2020–21.<sup>1</sup>

Government of Canada departments may set fees for services, licences, permits, products, the use of facilities, for other authorizations of rights or privileges, or to recover, in whole or in part, costs incurred in relation to a regulatory scheme.

For reporting purposes, fees must be categorized under the following three fee-setting mechanisms:

- 1. Act, regulation or fees notice
  - An act of Parliament delegates the fee-setting authority to a department, minister or Governor in Council.

## 2. Contract

 Ministers have the authority to enter into contracts, which are usually negotiated between the minister and an individual or organization, and which cover fees and other terms and conditions. In some cases, that authority may also be provided by an act of Parliament.

## 3. Market rate or auction

• The authority to set these fees is pursuant to an act of Parliament or regulation, and the minister, department or Governor in Council has no control over the fee amount.

This report contains information about all fees that are under Environment and Climate Change Canada's authority.

The information covers fees subject to the Service Fees Act.

For fees set by contract, fees set by market-rate, auction or both, the report provides totals only. For fees set by act, regulation or fees notice, it provides totals for fee groupings, as well as detailed information for each fee.

Although the fees that Environment and Climate Change Canada charges under the *Access to Information Act* were subject to the *Service Fees Act*, they are not included in this report. ## Remissions

The Biosphere will be able to resume its activities once its operations have been fully integrated into the City of Montréal and the circumstances surrounding the COVID-19 pandemic make it safe for staff and visitors to return.
