TRAINING THE NEXT

The CIHR Institute of Aging is committed to strengthening research capacity and supporting the next generation of researchers studying aging:

The Summer Program in Aging (SPA), our flagship program, offers advanced training to Canadian and international graduate students and postdoctoral fellows. This program provides the opportunity to have exposure to, learn from, and network with, leaders in the field both in Canada and abroad.

CIHR-IA Awards of Excellence in Research on Aging are presented to the highest-ranking applicants in the CIHR Doctoral and Fellowship Awards competitions whose research focuses on aging.

CIHR-IA Student Poster Competition Prizes are awarded at the Canadian Association on Gerontology Annual Scientific Meeting for the best posters presented by trainees.

The CIHR-IA Réjean Hébert Award in Geriatric **Research** is awarded for the best scientific presentation by a post-graduate medical trainee at the Annual Scientific Meeting of the Canadian Geriatric Society.

STRENGTHENING THE **COMMUNITY OF RESEARCHERS THROUGH PROGRAMS:**

Travel awards for trainees up to \$1,000



Through the Travel awards for trainees, master's and doctoral students, and post-doctoral fellows can attend and present their research at national and international meetings, symposia and conferences. Research must align with the Institute's mandate and advance their professional development and/or knowledge translation initiatives.

Planning and Dissemination Grants up to \$20,000



These grants provide support for planning and/ or dissemination activities consistent with the mandate of the Institute while addressing its research priority areas.

CIHR Institute of Aging Betty Havens Prize for Knowledge Translation in Aging – up to \$20,000



Named in honour of Betty Havens, a leading gerontologist committed to improving the lives of older adults, this prize recognizes an individual, team or organization that has advanced the translation of research in aging into useful knowledge for all stakeholders, at a local or regional level.

CIHR Institute of Aging Voluntary Sector Outreach Award – up to \$10,000



This award recognizes and supports up to two exceptional groups working in the non-profit and voluntary sector in their knowledge translation efforts in the area of aging.
