The CRTC, established in 1968 by the Broadcasting Act, regulates and supervises all aspects of the Canadian broadcasting system -- radio, television, and cable television, both public and private. The Canadian Radio-television and Telecommunications Act, declared on April 1, 1976, gives the CRTC regulatory power over the federally regulated telecommunications carriers.

Public hearings to consider broadcasting or telecommunications applications are a vital part of the Commission's role as a regulatory agency and are held throughout the year in all parts of Canada.

The Branch is also responsible for the Energuide program, under which major electrical household appliances are required to carry a label indicating consumption in kilowatt-hours per month.
