

OBJECTIVE:

CRTC Information Services provides information and handles complaints about the nature, quality, and availability of broadcasting and telecommunications services.

The CRTC, established in 1968 by the Broadcasting Act, regulates and supervises all aspects of the Canadian broadcasting system -- radio, television, and cable television, both public and private. The Canadian Radio-television and Telecommunications Act, declared on April 1, 1976, gives the CRTC regulatory power over the federally regulated telecommunications carriers.

Public hearings to consider broadcasting or telecommunications applications are a vital part of the Commission's role as a regulatory agency and are held throughout the year in all parts of Canada.

OBJECTIVE:

The Canadian Transport Commission regulates transportation under federal jurisdiction. It is a court of record. Its powers and duties are divided among seven committees. Five of these regulate different transport modes: air, rail, water, motor vehicle and commodity pipeline. The Commission's regulation of air and rail modes of transport affect most Canadians.

Railway Transport Committee (RTC)

The RTC regulates passenger and freight services with the object of ensuring the provision of adequate and suitable service in Canada.

Air Transport Committee (ATC)

The ATC regulates air services and prices to authorize provision of adequate air service to the public at reasonable rates, under fair competitive conditions and without unjust discrimination.

OBJECTIVE:

The Bureau of Consumer Affairs ensures that consumer interests are represented in all government activities that affect the marketplace and is involved with developing, often in co-operation with business and other government departments, programs for consumer protection and information.

Four branches within the Bureau are responsible for the development and administration of legislation and/or programs that affect the consumer. Inspection and other services are carried out through five regional offices.

1. Consumer Services promotes the effectiveness and the interests of consumers in the marketplace by offering information and technical support; funding self-help consumer groups; encouraging consumer awareness and corporate social responsibility in business and industry; promoting a marketplace committed to serving the needs of vulnerable consumers; and supporting the consumer interest in the administration and implementation of government programs and regulations, where pertinent.

It also serves as a point of referral for consumer complaints and enquiries. A combination of accurate referrals and information encourages consumers to develop a self-help approach in addressing their questions or complaints.

In addition, Consumer Services also administers the Tax Rebate Discounting Act in Ontario, Québec, New Brunswick, Newfoundland, the Northwest Territories and, in conjunction with the provincial government, in Manitoba.

2. Consumer Products is responsible through inspection, standards and guidelines, for the prevention of fraud in the production, labelling, packaging, advertising and sale of most consumer products such as textiles, precious metals, furs, pre-packaged products and manufactured foods. Graded agricultural products are similarly inspected at the retail level of trade. Revenue Canada, Taxation, collects federal individual and corporate income taxes; individual income taxes for all provinces except Québec; corporate income taxes for all provinces except Québec, Ontario and Alberta; petroleum and gas revenue taxes; and Canada Pension Plan contributions and Unemployment Insurance premiums.

For this, the department makes available to Canadians all the forms and technical instructions they need to assume their tax responsibilities.

CONSUMER ASSISTANCE:

There are 28 district taxation offices to serve as the point of contact between the department and taxpayers.

These offices distribute all forms and publications and answer taxpayers' questions. Complaints should also be directed to district offices. Addresses and telephone numbers of the district offices are listed in all local telephone directories and appear on the back of all income tax guides.


