Frequently Asked Questions

How should I prepare for my visit?

- · Research local and provincial public health orders, and follow travel
- · Download or print maps and other visitor information ahead of time.
- · Plan to visit during off-peak times. Go early in the morning or later in the afternoon.
- · Bring masks and hygiene supplies.
- Check parkscanada.gc.ca/covid-19 or contact a visitor centre to find out which programs and services are available



How is Parks Canada taking steps to ensure the health and safety of visitors?

Parks Canada follows the advice of public health experts.

- We have increased cleaning frequency and limited the number of people allowed inside facilities.
- In provinces or municipalities where facemasks are required to be worn indoors, visitors will be expected to wear masks.
- We have only opened places to the public when we can apply measures to reduce health and safety risks.

Will I have to wear a mask indoors?

Masks are required on all transit and shuttles and continue to be recommended in indoor facilities or where physical distancing is not feasible. Be prepared and bring your own mask.

Are there limits on the number of visitors allowed on each trail?

No, there are no limits to the number of visitors allowed on each trail.We ask that you keep a safe distance and share the trail respectfully.
