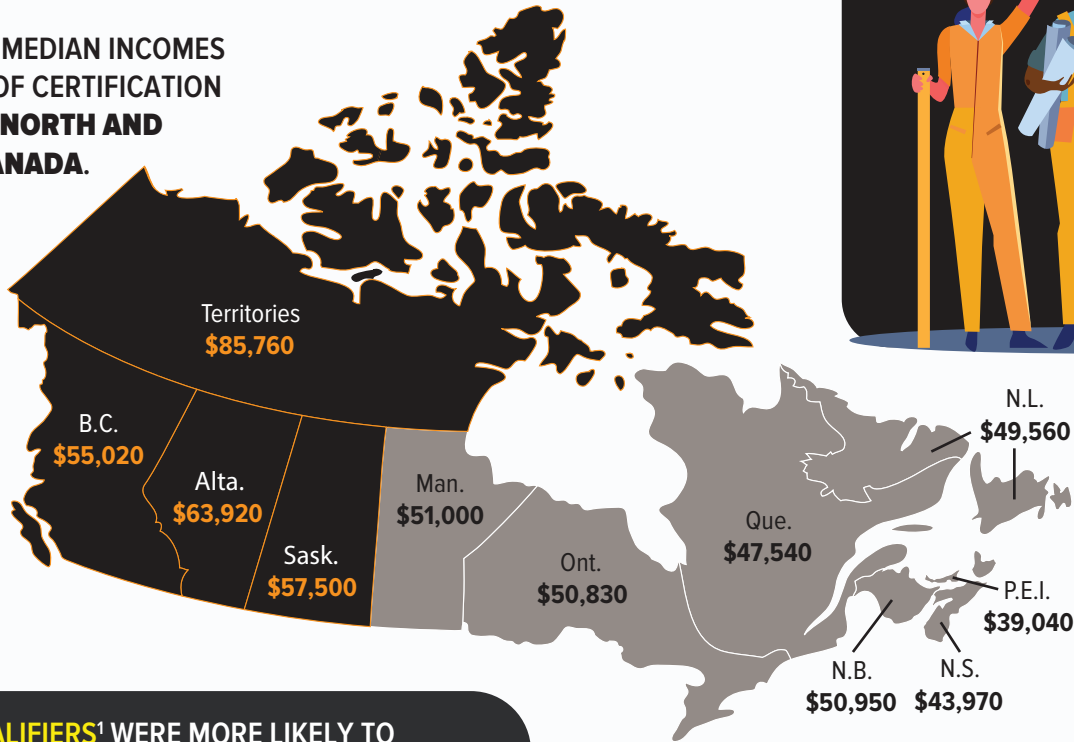


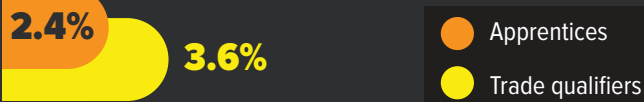

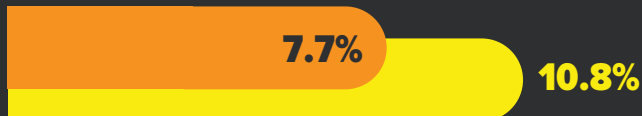

All non-Red Seal trades



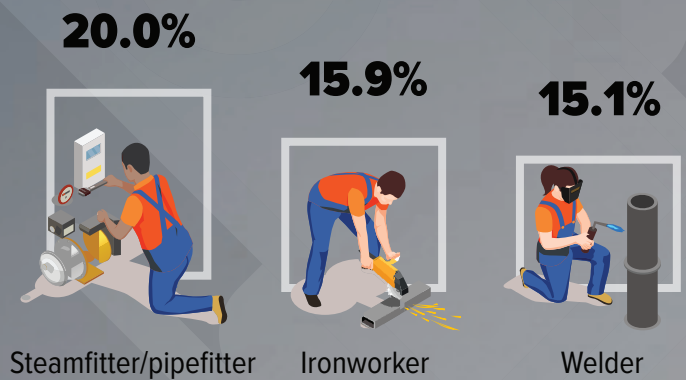
All Red Seal trades



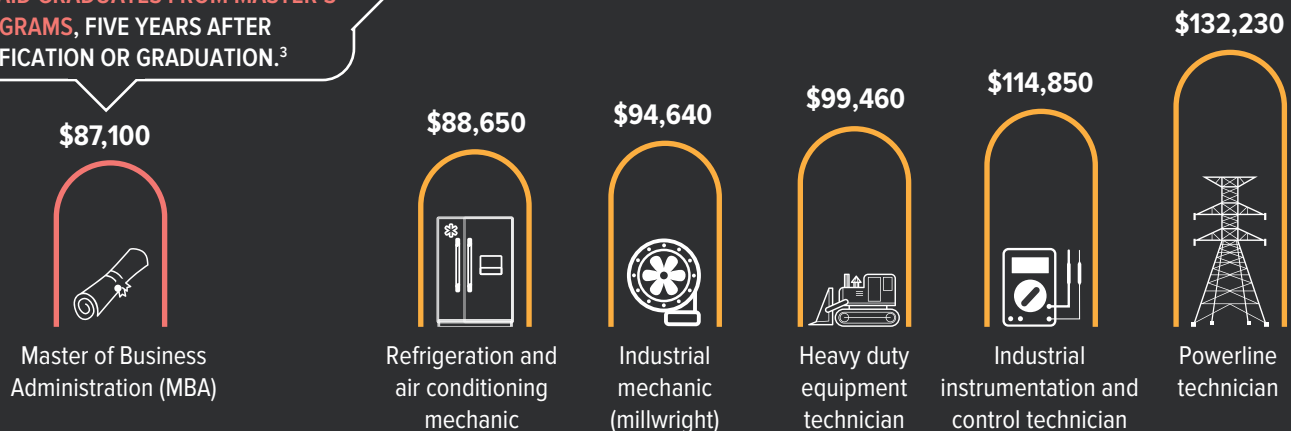

NOTES:

- Trade qualifiers are individuals who meet the on-the-job experience required to qualify for certification within a jurisdiction, without necessarily having completed an apprenticeship program.
- Journeymen are individuals who completed an apprenticeship program or trade qualifiers who have received a certificate of qualification.
- Median employment incomes are available for all trades at the aggregate level with details provided at the trade level for the top 25 Red Seal trades with the largest numbers of certifications in Canada.
