
Passenger bus and urban transit in Canada, 2019



In 2019, the transit industry in Canada was comprised of:


urban transit companies

inter-city bus companies

charter and sightseeing bus companies

school and employee bus companies

In 2019, urban transit companies accounted for almost three-quarters of the industry's \$15.3 billion in operating revenue.



Total operating revenue earned by urban transit companies reached **\$11.2 billion**, up 8% from 2018.

In 2019, the average salary for drivers in urban transit companies was



2. The data source is the Monthly Passenger Bus and Urban Transit Survey, which collects data on operating revenue (excluding subsidies) and number of passenger trips from a panel of urban transit companies that represent at least 75% of the industry's revenue in each province and territory.

3. "Other employees" are all other staff including owners and executives.
