



Fully vaccinated travellers entering Canada during COVID-19



Pre-border

- Check that you are eligible to enter Canada.
- Check that you meet the requirements of being fully vaccinated.
 - This means you have received:
 - the full series of a vaccine or a combination of vaccines accepted by the Government of Canada (Pfizer-BioNTech Comirnaty, Moderna Spikevax, AstraZeneca Vaxzevria/Covishield, Janssen/Johnson & Johnson, Bharat Biotech Covaxin, Sinopharm BIBP, Sinovac/CoronaVac/PiCoVacc, Novavax/Nuvaxovid/COVOVAX)
 - your last dose **at least 14 days before your travel to Canada**
- Fully vaccinated travellers must also meet all other entry criteria, including:
 - submitting all required COVID-19 information into ArriveCAN prior to travel (if arriving by air, information must be submitted **before** boarding a flight)
 - being asymptomatic upon arrival
 - having a paper or digital copy of your proof of vaccination in English or French (or certified translation)
 - having a suitable quarantine plan, in case it is required
- Meet the pre-entry testing requirements by presenting proof of either a:
 - negative COVID-19 molecular test result taken up to 72 hours before your scheduled flight to Canada, or arrival at the land border or marine port of entry;
 - negative COVID-19 antigen test result, taken no more than one calendar day before your scheduled flight to Canada, or arrival at the land border or marine port of entry;
 - positive COVID-19 molecular test result received in the previous 10 to 180 days before your scheduled flight to Canada, or arrival at the land border or marine port of entry. Positive antigen tests will not be accepted.



At the border

- Provide all required information and documents, including:
 - ArriveCAN receipt
 - pre-entry COVID-19 test results
 - proof of vaccination (paper or digital files)
 - other travel documents
- Answer all eligibility, vaccination and health screening questions.
- If you have symptoms, follow the instructions provided by the government representative.
- Fully vaccinated travellers coming from any country will not need to take a COVID-19 test on-arrival unless you are selected for mandatory random testing.
- Arrival testing could be on-site at the airport, offsite, or you may be provided a self-swab test kit at the border to take home. If you are not tested on site, you must complete and submit your specimen collection for processing within 24 hours of entering Canada.
- Follow the handout given to you at time of entry and all additional federal, provincial/territorial and local public health measures, including wearing a well-constructed mask, maintaining a list of contacts for the 14 days after entry to Canada.



What you need to enter into ArriveCAN:

- Identification, including your passport or other travel documents
- Contact and travel information
- 14-day travel history
- Quarantine plan
- Confirmation of a negative pre-entry test (or positive test taken 10 to 180 days before travel)
- Proof of vaccination (must be in English or French, or a certified translation)
- COVID-19 symptom self-assessment



After entry

- If you meet all the entry requirements, are fully vaccinated and are selected for mandatory random testing, you must take a test on arrival. You do not need to quarantine.
- If you meet all the entry requirements, are fully vaccinated and are not selected for mandatory random testing, you are exempt from quarantine, but you should take precautions for 14 days.
- Retain a list of names and contact information for all close contacts and locations visited for 14 days post-entry.
- If you test positive, or develop symptoms, during the 14 days after you arrive in Canada, you are required to isolate for 10 days from the start of symptoms or the specimen collection date validated by the test provider or date the test result is received (if specimen collection date not available), even if your province or territory has a shorter isolation period.
 - You also need to contact the Public Health Agency of Canada at 1-833-641-0343 **within 24 hours.**
