1. Introduction

The Annual Report on the *Privacy Act*, 2021–22 is prepared and tabled in Parliament in accordance with section 72 of the *Privacy Act*, which purpose is to protect the privacy of individuals with respect to their personal information held by a government institution and to provide a right of access to that information.

The Office of the Intelligence Commissioner (ICO) is an independent oversight body. The mandate of the Intelligence Commissioner (IC) is set out in the *Intelligence Commissioner Act*. The IC is an integral part of the decision-making process for certain national security and intelligence activities before they can be conducted. The IC is responsible for performing quasi-judicial reviews of the conclusions of either the Minister of National Defence or the Minister of Public Safety and Emergency Preparedness, and, where applicable, the Director of the Canadian Security Intelligence Service. These conclusions are the basis on which certain authorizations are issued or determinations are made in relation to some activities to be conducted by either the Communications Security Establishment or Canadian Security Intelligence Service.

2. Organizational Structure

The Executive Director has delegated authority to oversee the administration of the *Access to Information Act* and the *Privacy Act* within the ICO and ensure compliance with the legislation. The ICO is a separate agency consisting of 10.5 planned full-time equivalents.

3. Delegation Order for the Privacy Act

Pursuant to section 73 of the *Privacy Act*, the Intelligence Commissioner appointed the Executive Director with the duty to exercise full authorities under the *Privacy Act* and Regulations (Appendix A – *Access to Information Act* and *Privacy Act* Delegation Order).

4. Performance 2021-22

The ICO did not receive any requests for records under the *Privacy Act* during the reporting period.

5. Training and Awareness

The Executive Director and Internal Services personnel participated in awareness sessions concerning their responsibilities related to access to information and privacy.

6. Policies, Guidelines, Procedures and Initiatives

As a newly created institution, the ICO continued the establishment of institutional policies and procedures in the application of the *Privacy Act*, during the reporting period.

7. Summary of Key Issues and Actions Taken on Complaints

During the reporting period, no complaints were received and no audits or investigations were concluded.

8. Monitoring Compliance

The ICO utilizes a manual monitoring system. The monitoring system keeps track of upcoming deadlines for requests and consultations and provides reminders of approaching deadlines.

9. Material Privacy Breaches

There were no material privacy breaches reported to the Office of the Privacy Commissioner and to Treasury Board of Canada Secretariat (Information and Privacy Policy Division) during the reporting period.

10. Privacy Impact Assessments

During the reporting period, no privacy impact assessments were completed.

11. Public Interest Disclosures

During the reporting period, no disclosures were made under paragraph 8 (2)(m) of the *Privacy Act*.
