## Farm Products Council of Canada Annual Report to Parliament on the Access to Information Act

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#### A. Report on the Access to Information Act

#### A1. Introduction

The Access to Information Act gives Canadian citizens, permanent residents, and all individuals and corporations present in Canada the right of access to records under the control of a government institution subject to the Act. The Act complements, but does not replace, other means of obtaining government information.

This report is prepared and tabled in Parliament in accordance with Section 72 of the *Access to Information Act.* It covers the period from April 1, 2021, to March 31, 2022.

#### Mandate

The FPCC was established in 1972 under the *Farm Products Agencies Act* (the Act) as a unique public interest oversight body which reports to Parliament through the Minister of Agriculture and Agri-Food (The Minister).

The FPCC, headed by a Chairperson (Deputy Head) appointed by the Governor in Council, is composed of up to seven members of which at least half must be primary producers at the time of their appointment.

The Act provides for the creation of National Marketing Agencies and Promotion Research Agencies. There are currently four Marketing Agencies: Canadian Hatching Egg Producers, Chicken Farmers of Canada, Egg Farmers of Canada and Turkey Farmers of Canada. There are also two Promotion Research Agencies, the Canada Beef Check-Off Agency and the Canadian Pork Promotion and Research Agency. The FPCC supervises and works with these agencies to ensure that the supply management system for poultry and eggs and promotion research activities for beef cattle and pork work in the balanced interest of all stakeholders, from producers to consumers, and can evolve to respond to current and future challenges.

The FPCC also provides advice and recommendations to the Minister, collaborates with provincial supervisory boards and actively works with the Department and other Agriculture and Agri-Food Portfolio Organizations.

#### A2. Organizational Structure

The Director of Corporate and Governmental Affairs has delegated authority to oversee the administration of the *Access to Information Act* within Farm Products Council of Canada and to ensure compliance with the legislation. FPCC currently has one ATIP Coordinator and also relies on Agriculture & Agri-Food Canada (AAFC) as its service provider to the organization.

#### A3. Delegation Order

Section 73 of the *Access to Information Act* provides for the Minister, as head of Agriculture & Agri-Food Canada, to delegate the powers, duties and functions designated by the *Act*.

#### A4. Performance 2021-2022

FPCC responded to 100% of the requests within the legislated timelines with 2 requests being completed in 1-30 days and 1 request that was abandoned.

There are no active requests or complaints outstanding from previous periods as well as no requests for consultation from other institutions.

Of the 2 requests completed, 1 (50%) was "all disclosed" and 1 (50%) was "disclosed in part".

Working remotely due to COVID-19 had no impact on FPCC's ability to fulfill its *Access to Information Act* responsibilities.

#### A5. Training and Awareness

There was no orientation and awareness session undertaken for the 2021-2022 reporting period.

#### A6. Policies, Guidelines, Procedures and Initiatives

FPCC did not implement any new policies, procedures or initiatives on the administration of the *Access to Information Act* for the 2021-2022 reporting period.

#### A7. Summary of Key Issues and Actions Taken on Complaints or Audits

FPCC received no complaints concerning the *Access to Information Act* during the 2021-2022 reporting period.

#### A8. Monitoring of Compliance

No monitoring was conducted during the 2021-2022 reporting period.

#### **A9. Service Fees**
