Council Decisions and FPCC Activities Update

The Farm Products Council of Canada (FPCC) continues to conduct its business virtually, which includes holding Council meetings more frequently. Since the beginning of the year, Council has already met eleven times.

Council Meeting of October 13, 2021

Council members met on October 13, 2021, and approved Chicken Farmers of Canada's (CFC) proposed changes to the Canadian Chicken Marketing Quota Regulations for the A-173 allocation period that runs from November 21, 2021, to January 15, 2022.

Additionally, members reviewed the proposed amendments to the Canadian Hatching Egg Producers Quota Regulations, Schedule 1 (final allocation for 2021) and Schedule 2 (revised allocation for 2022). The Canadian Hatching Egg Producer's (CHEP) proposed a 2021 final allocation of 1.1% above the 2021 revised allocation and a 2022 revised allocation of 2.5% above the 2022 initial allocation. Council members approved CHEP's Quota amendments.

Agreement (LDAA). This new agreement is now in effect for the 2021 production year. This represents a milestone for their sector by addressing concerns raised by provincial boards and introduces new policies to strengthen production discipline. Finally, members reviewed and discussed the proposed amendment to the

Canadian Turkey Marketing Quota Regulations, 1990. Council members postponed their decision on Turkey Farmers of Canada's (TFC) proposed

amendment until the next Council meeting. Furthermore, FPCC had the pleasure of meeting with representatives from TFC for their annual presentation with Council members.

Attending on behalf of TFC, were Darren Ference, (Chair), Calvin McBain, (Vice-Chair), Phil Boyd, (Executive Director) and Sateesh Ramkissoonshingh, (Manager of Policy and Trade). Mr. Ference presented an overview of the turkey sector, including a market update, the "Think Turkey" Campaign, the Allocation Policy Review and TFC's Strategic Plan.

FPCC hosted the National Association of Agri-Food Supervisory Agencies meeting

on October 18, 2021, which focused on the Grocery Code of Conduct. Ms. Justine Akman, Director General of the Retail and Consumer Task Team at Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada and Mr. Yvon Doyle, Director of Trade and Intergovernmental Policies at the Ministère de l'Agriculture, des Pêcheries et de l'Alimentation du Québec, presented the Findings of the Federal-Provincial-Territorial Working **Group on Retail Fees in the Canadian Food Industry.** As always, this meeting was a great opportunity to share information across the

provinces and discuss the Grocery Code of Conduct topic as well as related challenges affecting agriculture and agri-food sectors. The date for the second meeting is now confirmed for December 6, 2021. The focus will be on Proactive **Animal Welfare Inspections. Complaint from the CPEPC against TFC**

On September 29, 2021, Council Vice-Chair, Ron Bonnett, presided over the complaint pre-hearing conference to simplify any issues subject to the Complaint,

identify facts raised by the Parties, facilitate discussions and inform participants of Council's roles and powers in hearing the Complaint. Following the pre-hearing conference, FPCC Chairman, Brian Douglas informed

the Parties and stakeholders on the composition of the Complaint Committee. He appointed Council member Maryse Dubé who will preside and proceed with the hearing. The documents related to the complaint are posted on FPCC's website.
