Dear Dr. Andrieu:

I am pleased to submit final documentation representing the completion of our contract which was to conduct a computer-based survey of selected on-line bibliographic data bases for literature relevant to transborder data flow, and present the results in a subject-oriented package.

Submitted are three copies of the final bibliography, and one electronic version on AES disks. This bibliography covers 1981 - 1982 and consists of about 600 records culled from the total of about 6,000 retrieved, covering 1975-1982.

Also submitted are copies of all printouts, (the 6,000 records) organized by on-line data base, with additional information describing each data base, as well as the search strategy in detail.

The study provides the task force with a bibliography which is of use immediately, as well as providing the basis on which to build up an AES compatible, updateable bibliographic data base.







PARAMETERS

The parameters of the study were to conduct a computer-based survey of on-line bibliographic data bases for literature relevant to all aspects of transborder data flow of concern to the task force; to search selected on-line data bases comprehensively from 1975 to the present (april 1, 1982).

The project can be divided into the following stages:


- 1) development of the search statement
- 2) data capture
- 3) selection of relevant records
- 4) data entry into computing work space
- 5) sorting into subject groups
- 6) producing printouts, disks



A parameter of the study was altered april 1 before commencing to select and sort the records. We captured, in printed form, about 6,000 records, since 1975, of which about 60% would be selected for the final data base. It was decided to limit the final stages, in terms of this contract, to 1981 and 1982. This comprises about 600 records. It is recommended that 1975 through 1980 be compiled into the present machine readable bibliography as well, which would then total about 4,200 records.

OPERATIONS

Various communication interfaces were used in the first stages of the study. A micom 200le and an aes plus word processor were successfully re-profiled to communicate with the dial-up network in Canada and the US at 1200 baud. However, at this speed some data was occasionally lost, during continuous retrieval. An xon xoff protocol would have to be initiated to tell the host computer to stop transmission when the local buffer is almost full, and this would slow the print-out, increasing costs. We were not able to profile the word processors in this way. In this study the data was captured on a hardcopy terminal. Future on-line retrieval operations of this size should be conducted in a computing environment with sufficient storage capacity to capture an on-line print-out of possibly 150,000 characters.



SEARCH STRATEGY

The search statement developed over the course of the retrieval successfully captures relevant literature while limiting the amount of irrelevancy. The strategy was fairly complicated because we were dealing with a subject which is really multi-disciplinary, and the terms 'infomation' and 'data' were themselves key words, not secondary attributes of the text. The searching was limited, in most cases, to title and descriptors, as abstracts introduced too much noise. The search is an interactive process; once the basic strategy has been run, groups are immediately selected for 'print-out', or combined with other groups as necessary. A schematic:



DOCUMENTATION

This selected bibliography, 1981 and 1982, resides on aes-plus mini disks. All records retrieved, 1975 to 1982, are organized by name of the on-line file, in folders. These contain a description of the on-line data base, the strategy and a copy of the complete printout. The parallel records in the print-outs contain more detailed information. 
