### **Operations under the Act**

The Foreign Investment Review Act requires the Government of Canada to review two types of foreign investment to ensure significant benefit to Canada: most acquisitions of control by non-Canadians of existing businesses in Canada; and the establishment of new businesses in Canada by non-Canadians who either do not already have a business in Canada or do not have a business to which the new business is or would be related.

#### **CASELOAD** (Table I)

The number of applications received by the Agency increased to 1,010 in 1983-84 from 943 the preceding year. Of that number, 973 were certified as subject to review under the Act. Most of the 973 cases (85 percent) involved the acquisition of assets or the establishment of businesses with planned investments worth \$5 million or less.

The following sections provide a profile of acquisition and new business cases and a discussion of the benefits to Canada expected from investments that were allowed. Readers can find detailed statistical tables on the cases in Appendix A.

#### Acquisitions (Tables II to IX)

The number of reviewable acquisition cases increased in 1983-84 to 461 from 427 in 1982-83. Of the 461 cases, 52 percent involved the acquisition of business enterprises in Canada which were already foreign-controlled and, 73 percent of the proposals involved the acquisition of businesses with assets of less than \$5 million. The total value of assets of businesses being acquired decreased to \$4.5 billion in 1983-84 from \$5.3 billion in 1982-83.

The distribution of cases by industrial sector was similar to that of previous years with over half the cases (53 percent) in the service sector, 44 percent in manufacturing and 3 percent in resources. The provincial distribution of cases was as follows: 60 percent in Ontario; 17 percent in Quebec; 10 percent in British Columbia; and 9 percent in Alberta. The provincial distribution of cases from the United States, Western Europe, and other countries was roughly the same as the provincial distribution of all cases. Most acquisition proposals (68 percent) came from the United States and 26 percent from Western Europe, in particular the United Kingdom (10 percent). The distribution of cases by industrial sector did not vary with the country of origin, the service sector leading, followed by manufacturing and resources.

In 1983-84, 468 acquisition cases were resolved (allowed, disallowed or withdrawn). Of these, 430 were allowed by the Governor in Council, 5 were disallowed, and 33 were withdrawn by the applicants before a decision was made.

#### New businesses (Tables XII to XXI)

The number of reviewable new business proposals increased from 460 in 1982-83 to 512 in 1983-84. The total value of planned investment in the reviewable new business proposals reached \$2.7 billion. Of the 512 reviewable proposals, 95 percent involved planned investments of less than \$5 million. Eight cases alone accounted for 84 percent of the total value of planned investment.

Sixty-nine percent of the cases concerned the establishment of new businesses in the service sector, 27 percent in manufacturing, and 4 percent in resources. The manufacturing sector (77 percent) led in terms of the value of planned investment, however, followed by services (20 percent). Most of the planned investment (88 percent) in manufacturing was in primary metals and was attributable to major French investment proposals involving Quebec. This also explains why Quebec's share of the total value of planned investment reached 69 percent with only 14 percent of the total number of proposals. Ontario's share of the number of proposals was 58 percent, British Columbia's 9 percent, Alberta's 7 percent and Nova Scotia's 6 percent. The provincial distribution of the number of cases did not vary with the country of origin.

The distribution of cases by country of origin was 56 percent from the United States, 30 percent from Western Europe, including the United Kingdom, and 19 percent from other countries.

The number of resolved new business cases decreased from 56l in 1982-83 to 493 in 1983-84. Of the 493 resolved cases, 428 were allowed and 22 disallowed by the Governor in Council and 43 were withdrawn by applicants prior to a decision by the Governor in Council.

#### Significant benefit

All investments which, in the judgement of the Government, offer significant benefit to Canada according to the factors set out in subsection 2(2) of the Act, are allowed. Briefly, the factors concern the impact of a proposal on the economy in terms of employment, use of parts and services produced in Canada, exports and so on, the impact on Canadian participation, on industrial efficiency and technological development, and on competition, and the compatibility of a proposal with enunciated national and provincial economic and industrial policies. The weight given to each of the factors relevant to a particular case necessarily varies according to the nature of the proposal, the sector in which the investment is to occur, the region in which it is to be made, the kinds of undertaking, if any, offered by the applicant, and other factors and circumstances unique to each case.

Planned new investment and employment are about the only readily quantifiable benefits associated with foreign investment proposals under the Act. Though great care must be taken in using or interpreting these figures — one large case during a year can distort the figures just as the absence of such a case can from one year to the next — they do provide some measure of the benefits likely to result from allowance under the Act. Fiscal year 1982-83 was a record year for new investment and employment benefits with planned new investment up 89 percent and saved or planned jobs up 61 percent. In 1983-84 planned new investment continued to increase; it rose over 35 percent to \$4.1 billion. Both acquisition and especially new business proposals contributed to the increase; planned new investment rose over 14 percent in the former and 56 percent in the latter. Though the total number of jobs planned and saved reached 24,089, it was nonetheless 22 percent less than the record 31,215 jobs recorded last year. There was, however, a 15 percent increase in the number of jobs planned in acquisition cases. Detailed figures are presented in the table below.

To illustrate the variety of benefits that will result from cases allowed in 1983-84, there follow descriptions of two allowed proposals. In each case the permission of the applicant to disclose this information was sought and obtained.

One case involved a proposal by Hewlett-Packard (Canada) of Mississauga, Ontario, to acquire control of Panacom Automation Inc. of Scarborough, Ontario. The proposal was allowed in May 1983. Panacom was a firm which designed and manufactured equipment and computer software used in monitoring industrial processes in the chemical and energy sectors. Hewlett-Packard (Canada) is a wholly-owned subsidiary of the Hewlett-Packard Company of Palo Alto, California.

According to its proposal Hewlett-Packard was to invest \$10 million in a manufacturing facility and to create up to 700 new jobs by the end of 1988. Moreover, Hewlett-Packard planned to assign a number of high-technology world product mandates to Panacom and it expected exports from Panacom to reach \$70 million by 1988. Subject to the availability of qualified personnel, Canadians were to be employed in all positions and, where qualified Canadians were not available, Hewlett-Packard was to ensure that Canadians would be trained to take over certain highly specialized positions that would temporarily be occupied by foreign personnel. In addition Panacom was to spend the equivalent of at least 6 percent of the value of previous-year shipments on R&D and to engage substantial funds for R&D projects in Canadian universities.

Another example of benefits is provided in the allowed proposal by Canadian General Electric Company Limited of Toronto, Ontario, to acquire control of Camco Inc. of Weston, Ontario, which was jointly controlled by Canadian General Electric and GSW Inc. The proposal was allowed in July 1983.

In addition to providing for continued substantial Canadian participation in the ownership and management of Camco, the proposal outlined significant initiatives to strengthen Camco's operations to meet the challenges of the future. Canadian General Electric's proposal called for extensive plant modernization and rationalization involving expenditures of at least \$50 million by 1988 on machinery, tooling and related areas. This represented a substantial increase in such expenditures over those of the previous five years. Such development plans were viewed favourably as improving Camco's prospects and thus the job security of its employees.

Canadian General Electric also planned to introduce the latest available manufacturing technologies to achieve major productivity gains aimed at making Camco products internationally cost competitive. The acquisition was expected to provide Camco better access to the technology and financial resources of CGE and its U.S. parent. And, new products were to be developed in Canada for both the domestic and export markets.

The two examples cited are only an illustration of the range and value of the benefits associated with allowed cases. The reader may wish to refer to appendices B and C of this report for a complete list of the cases decided during 1983-84 and the benefits associated with them.

#### **OPINIONS**

Two types of opinion are provided to foreign investors on request: first, subsection 4(1) of the Act authorizes the Minister to give opinions as to whether or not an investor is a "non-eligible person" (i.e. non-Canadian), and as to whether or not the activities of a new or acquired business are, or would be, related to the activities of a non-eligible person's existing business in Canada; second, to assist investors and their legal counsel the Agency gives its own opinions, under certain circumstances, on whether or not a proposed or actual investment is reviewable under the Act. Ministerial opinions are formally binding on the Minister for a period of two years, provided that all material facts are disclosed at the time the application is made and that these facts remain substantially unchanged. Agency opinions are not binding on the Minister.

In 1983-84, thirteen ministerial opinions were given to the effect that the applicants were not non-eligible persons. In addition, four applicants withdrew their applications before an opinion was given. Of the opinions given, seven were renewals of earlier opinions, following the expiry of their respective two-year periods.

The Minister also gave three favourable opinions on "relatedness". The establishment of a business in Canada by a non-eligible person is not reviewable if the activities of the new business are related to the activities of the business already being carried on by that person in Canada.

In 1983-84 the Agency responded to over 2,000 enquiries related to the interpretation and applicability of the Act. Specifically, it provided over 525 formal and informal opinions to foreign investors and legal counsel on how the Act applied or did not apply to their projected investments.

#### **SURVEILLANCE**

The Foreign Investment Review Act empowers the Minister to require that a notice in the prescribed form be filed when a non-eligible person proposes to make or has made an investment which is subject to review and has failed to file notice.

In 1983-84, numerous reports from the news media and unsolicited information from individuals and companies resulted in 267 detailed investigations concerning proposed or actual acquisitions of Canadian business enterprises or the establishment of new businesses in Canada, where no notice had been filed. These investigations led directly to the filing of 78 acquisition and new-business notices.

#### **ENFORCEMENT**

All cases decided under the Act are followed up to ensure that investors are meeting the terms and conditions of their allowance, or in disallowed cases, to ensure that investors are not proceeding with the investment contrary to the Governor in Council decision. In 1983-84, in accordance with established procedures, the Enforcement Division monitored the implementation of plans and undertakings provided by investors in 1,355 proposals that had been allowed. In addition, 27 disallowed cases were monitored to ensure compliance with the decision of the Governor in Council.

#### LEGAL PROCEEDINGS

The Foreign Investment Review Act authorizes the Minister to initiate legal proceedings in any case where the investor fails to file notice as required by the Act, or fails to meet the terms and conditions of his investment as set out in his investment notice or in the plans and undertakings connected with it, or fails to comply with an order of disallowance.

#### **Ambassador Bridge**

Central Cartage Company and the Detroit International Bridge Company (DIBC), owners of the Ambassador Bridge linking Windsor and Detroit, commenced proceedings in the United States District Court in Michigan against the Crown, various ministers and officials and past officials of FIRA for alleged losses arising out of the Government's disallowance of the acquisition of control by the plaintiffs of the Canadian side of the bridge. The Attorney General commenced proceedings on November 26, 1982 under the Act for an Order rendering the investment by DIBC nugatory. The trial in the U.S. court in Michigan to hear Canada's application to have the proceedings dismissed was held in June 1983. The proceedings against the Crown were dismissed by Order dated December 22, 1983, as being premature in light of the Crown's application for a nugatory Order. The plaintiffs have filed a claim to appeal. A trial date for the Crown's action has not been set.

#### KSC, Ltd.

The new-business investment proposal by KSC (formerly Kero-Sun Canada, Ltd.) was disallowed April 16, 1981, and a second application was disallowed May 6, 1982. In June 1982, an application was made to the Federal Court, Trial Division, for an Order rendering the investment by KSC nugatory. The trial was held August 26 and 27, 1982. Judgement was rendered on May 16, 1983 dismissing the Crown's application.

#### Oilfield Fluids, Inc.

Oilfield's proposal to acquire Brinadd of Canada Ltd. was disallowed September 3, 1982. Oilfield contended that the transaction was not reviewable and that, consequently, the disallowance order was of no effect. In February 1983, an application was made to the Federal Court, Trial Division, for an Order rendering the investment by Oilfield nugatory. The trial was held May 18, 1983 in Calgary, but judgement had not been given by the end of fiscal year 1983-84.

#### **Philip Morris Incorporated**

In April 1981 Philip Morris acquired in the United Kingdom 50 percent of the shares of Rothmans Tobacco Holdings Ltd. (RTH), the grandparent corporation of the Canadian group of Rothmans companies. A demand was issued by the Ministerrequiring Philip Morris to file a notice of its investment. On May 25, 1982, Philip Morris commenced an action in the Federal Court, Trial Division, for a declaration that its indirect acquisition was not reviewable on the basis that control of the Canadian business was not acquired. The Crown filed a Statement of Defence on March 1, 1984. On March 22, 1984, Philip Morris announced a restructuring of its holdings in RTH. Philip Morris has taken no further steps in this action to date.

#### **ADMINISTRATION**


For fiscal year 1983-84, the Agency was assigned a budgetary allotment of \$6,658,000 and 134 person-years. The actual expenditure was about \$5,600,000 and 132 person-years were utilized. During the year, administrative activities continued to be carried out in accordance with the policies and procedures of the Treasury Board and the Public Service Commission. Efforts were continued to meet the requirements of the Official Languages Act. The number of positions designated as bilingual increased from 57 to 64, which represents 47 percent of the positions in the Agency. Preliminary steps were also taken to advance the Affirmative Action program. Information was provided to all employees to make them aware of and understand the objectives of the program.

#### **Organization of the Agency**

The Foreign Investment Review Agency, whose sole responsibility is to advise and assist the Minister responsible for the administration of the Act, has three operational units: Compliance Branch, Assessment Bureau and Policy, Research and Communications Branch. Their functions and responsibilities are described below. All units of the Agency are supported by the Personnel and Administration Division, which reports directly to the Commissioner. Legal services are provided to the Agency by Department of Justice advisors.

#### **COMPLIANCE BRANCH**

The Compliance Branch is responsible for ensuring that the legal requirements of the Act are met.




The Rulings Division receives and verifies notices from investors who submit their investment proposals for review under the Act. It provides informal advice to investors, their counsel and Agency officials on the applicability of the Act and assists the Minister in discharging his statutory responsibility for issuing formal opinions on the eligibility status of applicants and on whether or not the proposed new business activities are related to existing activities of a business.

The Enforcement Division carries out a program of surveillance to identify reviewable transactions for which notices have not been filed and ensures that they are submitted for review under the Act. It regularly monitors the implementation of plans and undertakings offered by investors whose applications have been allowed. It also ensures that investors whose proposals have been disallowed by the Governor in Council comply with the orders of disallowance within a reasonable period of time. This may involve making sure that new businesses which may have already been established cease operating; causing and monitoring the divestiture of an acquired Canadian business enterprise; and making certain that investment proposals that are disallowed are not implemented. The Enforcement Division also conducts investigations and inspections, informally or formally under the authority of the Act, into apparent instances of failure to comply with the Act, including implementation of investment proposals without Governor in Council approval, or on terms different from those contained in the proposal. And, it advises the Minister to invoke, when necessary, the remedial provisions of the Act (injunctions, nugatory orders, or orders to comply with undertakings).

#### ASSESSMENT BUREAU


The Assessment Bureau, which is at the heart of the Agency's operations, analyses investment proposals against the factors for the assessment of significant benefit to Canada. It has three branches, each carrying out the same functions in relation to one of the three broad sectors of the economy, namely: Resource Industries; Manufacturing Industries and Construction and Services. In addition, a Small Business Group provides rapid analysis and assessment of small business proposals in the manufacturing and service sectors.



In all four units the analysis is based primarily on information provided by the investor in the notice and information on companies and sectors provided by federal departments and agencies with policy responsibilities and expertise in the industry sectors involved. The Bureau also maintains direct contact with provincial governments in order to determine how investment proposals relate to their industrial and economic policy objectives. Following this analysis, the Bureau advises and assists the Minister in his assessment of the proposals. The sections in this report on the caseload and significant benefits provide further insight into the work of the Assessment Bureau.

#### POLICY, RESEARCH AND COMMUNICATIONS BRANCH

The Policy, Research and Communications Branch is responsible primarily for research and analysis in support of Agency operations and the development of government policy related to foreign investment. It reviews results achieved through the administration of the Act and helps to develop new approaches to improve the effectiveness of the program.



The Policy Research Division briefs ministers, senior Agency officials, Canadian businessmen, the international investment community and other interest groups on the many issues related to foreign investment policy of Canada and other industrialized countries. Other functions include responding to questions and enquiries from members of Parliament and senators and from the general public, receiving visitors at the Agency who seek information on the program and the Act, and providing speakers for seminars and engagements on various topics surrounding the issue of foreign investment in Canada. Policy research is the centre of the Division's work, and to this end, it participates in the Interdepartmental Committee on International Investment Policies (which is chaired by the Department of External Affairs and is concerned with a host of international issues, many of which have major implications for foreign investment policy) and participates in the work of the Committee on International Investment and Multinational Enterprises of the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development. The Division also carries out a wide range of research projects on various aspects of foreign direct investment, including the behaviour of multinational enterprises and appropriate alternative policy approaches.

The Industrial and Corporate Analysis Division is responsible for advice and analysis on industrial and corporate performance in support of the assessment and enforcement functions of the Agency. Responsibility was also added in 1983-84 for providing corporate information to Agency users and for carrying out a number of special projects, including an analysis of the Agency's experience in the use of the Guidelines Concerning Related Business issued pursuant to the Foreign Investment Review Act. The Division continued to provide advice in the determination under the Guidelines of whether or not proposed investments are related to the existing Canadian business of applicants. In 1983-84 the Division provided over 60 studies in support of the Agency's assessment and enforcement roles. Some 212 requests for corporate information on 542 companies were met and economic analysis provided for 63 enquiries on relatedness issues.


The Statistics Unit compiles and maintains data on investments reviewed and on the review process for purposes of internal management, reporting and research. The unit provides statistical analysis in support of the Agency's information program, including responses to parliamentary and other enquiries.


The Communications Division is responsible for providing general information services including responding to general enquiries, directing technical enquiries to the appropriate Agency officers, preparing and distributing general and technical information material. The Division also prepares the Agency's annual report to Parliament and is responsible for providing the editorial and production services required for Agency publications.

#### **REVIEW PROCESS**

As soon as a notice outlining an investment proposal is received by the Foreign Investment Review Agency, it is examined by the Compliance Branch to determine whether or not the proposal is reviewable and whether the notice contains all of the information prescribed by the Foreign Investment Review Regulations. If the proposal is judged reviewable and complete, it is passed on to the Assessment Bureau for evaluation based on the benefit factors outlined in the Act. Frequently, during this stage, information additional to that contained in the notice is sought and obtained through contacts with the applicant and consultations with appropriate federal departments. The proposal is also circulated to the province or provinces that would be significantly affected by the investment for their views and comments. Once all the necessary information has been assembled the case is then referred to the Minister, together with an assessment by the Agency of the perceived effects of the investment by reference to the factors prescribed in subsection 2(2) of the Act. If the Minister concludes that the investment is likely to result in significant benefit to Canada he must make a recommendation to the Governor in Council that the investment be allowed. If not, the applicant is informed accordingly. The applicant then has the opportunity to make further representations. When those representations are completed the case is referred to the Minister a second time for a final decision as to what his recomendation will be.
