His Excellency, The Right Honourable Edward Schreyer, P.C., Governor General of Canada, Ottawa, Ontario.

Your Excellency:

As Minister responsible for the administration of the Foreign Investment Review Act, I have the honour to present to your Excellency the Ninth Annual Report under the Act for the fiscal year ended March 31, 1983.

In presenting this year's report, I am obliged to draw to your attention several significant changes that occurred during the year and which are reflected in the body of the report. These changes were announced in the June 28, 1982, Budget presented by the Minister of Finance, and relate to both the Regulations pursuant to the Act and to the administration of the review process.

Concerning the Regulations, and with the intent of clarifying requirements under the Act, steps were taken to revise the Regulations under the Act and to re-design and simplify the forms which investors use to file notice of their investments.

With respect to the process, one initiative was to raise the thresholds under which the short-form review would apply and to introduce the practice of focusing only on key issues. The implementation of these and other administrative changes enabled the Government to reach decisions on 66 percent more proposals than in the previous year. This increase in the rate of processing enabled the Government to eliminate the backlog of outstanding notices and to process an increase of 18 percent in the number of new investment proposals received. This streamlining of the process has included a number of other innovations to both expedite and clarify the process to remove unnecessary delays and confusion for investors.

I have highlighted these changes to explain the very dramatic increase in the number of proposals received and brought to decision as reflected in the data for the period under review.

Operations under the Act

The Foreign Investment Review Act requires the Government of Canada to review two types of foreign investment to ensure significant benefit to Canada: most acquisitions of control by non-Canadians of existing businesses in Canada; and the establishment of new businesses in Canada by non-Canadians who either do not already have a business in Canada or do not have a business in Canada to which the new business is or would be related.

1982-83: A YEAR OF STREAMLINING

The Government had two priorities concerning the Foreign Investment Review Act in 1982-83: to streamline its administration and to clarify its interpretation. With a growing backlog of cases under review, it became clear that the administration of the Act, which had remained virtually unchanged for several years, needed important reforms in order to be effective and timely. As for the interpretation of the Act, the Foreign Investment Review Agency had identified a number of provisions and expressions in the Act which, over the years, had proven to be particularly difficult to interpret. Action was taken on both fronts.

The streamlining began when the Government announced in its June 1982 Budget that it intended to introduce measures designed to allow a greater percentage of reviewable investment proposals to qualify for the shorter and simpler review procedure. To do this, the eligibility ceilings for the small-business procedure were raised from \$2 million in assets and 100 employees to \$5 million and 200 employees for proposals involving direct acquisitions or the establishment of new Canadian businesses by foreign investors. In addition, indirect acquisitions — those involving the transfer of control of a Canadian business through a foreign merger or takeover of a foreign-parent were also made eligible for the small-business procedure when they involve businesses with assets of less than \$15 million and fewer than 600 employees. Measures were also taken to streamline discussions with investors concerning undertakings which they submit along with their investment proposals. Discussions are now confined to only those undertakings which relate to key elements of an investment proposal.

The impact of these budgetary changes and a streamlining of the review process under the Act was reflected in a number of ways in 1982-83. The number of cases brought to decision increased 66 percent over the previous fiscal year. This increase in the rate of decision-making enabled the Government to respond promptly to all notices received during the fiscal year, the number of which in fact increased by 18 percent over 1981-82. Additionally, the inventory of outstanding cases at the beginning of the year was reduced by 55 percent by year-end, virtually eliminating the backlog of long-outstanding cases. Thus, in 1982-83, investors whose proposals were subject to review under the Act found less difficulty in understanding the requirements and expectations of the Government with respect to obtaining approval and in turn received prompt reactions from the Government to their investment plans.

Measures were also taken to clarify the interpretation of the Act. For example, the Minister authorized the Foreign Investment Review Agency to issue interpretation notes covering provisions and expressions in the Act that experience has shown to be difficult to interpret. Six notes were issued in 1982 concerning limited partnerships, single or isolated contracts, rights to acquire shares or property, businesses that have ceased operations, and the phrases "part of a business capable of being carried on as a separate business" and "substantially all of the property used in carrying on the business".

The Minister also authorized the Agency to provide formal opinions to investors on whether or not their investments are subject to review under the Act. Such opinions had previously been given on an informal basis to assist and guide investors.

New appointments

In September 1982, the Honourable Edward C. Lumley was appointed Minister of Industry, Trade and Commerce and Regional Economic Expansion and also Minister responsible for the administration of the Foreign Investment Review Act. Mr. Lumley, who had been Minister of State (International Trade), replaced the Honourable Herb Gray. Mr. Gray was named President of the Treasury Board. In October 1982, Robert L. Richardson was appointed Commissioner of the Foreign Investment Review Agency. Gorse Howarth, who had been Commissioner for six years, was named President of the Canadian Commercial Corporation.

CASELOAD (Table I)

The number of reviewable applications reached 887 in 1982-83 compared with 739 in 1981-82. Cases involving assets or planned investments of less than \$5 million accounted for 72 percent of the 887 reviewable applications.

What follows is a profile of acquisition and new-business cases including some discussion of the benefits to Canada of investments that were allowed.

Acquisitions (Tables II to XI)

The number of reviewable acquisition applications increased to 427 in 1982-83 from 338 in 1981-82. Of the 427 applications, 226 involved Canadian-controlled acquiree businesses and 201, foreign-controlled acquiree businesses. Acquiree businesses with assets of less than \$5 million accounted for 73 percent of the reviewable acquisition applications. The total value of assets of acquirees in 1982-83 amounted to \$5.3 billion compared to \$8.5 billion in 1981-82.

The distribution of cases by industrial sector was amost identical to that of 1981-82 with services accounting for 55 percent, manufacturing 39 percent and resources 6 percent. Of the 168 manufacturing cases, half involved four industries, namely metal fabricating, food and beverages, machinery and chemical products. While the industrial distribution of cases by number of cases was the same, the distribution by the value of acquiree assets changed considerably in 1982-83 with the manufacturing sector's share decreasing from 61 to 48 percent and that of the service sector from 34 to 31 percent, while the resource sector's share increased from 5 to 21 percent.

As far as provincial distribution was concerned, Ontario accounted for 58 percent of the reviewable acquisition cases, followed by Quebec (16 percent), and British Columbia and Alberta (about 11 percent each). The other provinces and the territories accounted for only about 4 percent of the cases. On the basis of value of acquiree assets the provincial distribution was much different with Ontario accounting for 32 percent, Alberta 25 percent, British Columbia 22 percent and Quebec 21 percent.

The U.S. share of cases rose to 64 percent in 1982-83 from 58 percent in 1981-82, whereas that of Western Europe decreased to 28 percent from 35 percent. However, on the basis of the value of acquiree assets, the U.S. share decreased to 48 percent in 1982-83 from 64 percent in 1981-82, while that of Western Europe increased from 26 to 34 percent, as did that of "other countries" from 10 to 18 percent.

Most U.S. cases involved Ontario (64 percent), Quebec and Alberta (11 percent each) and British Columbia (10 percent). The pattern was similar for Western European cases with Ontario involved in 47 percent, Quebec 22 percent, and Alberta and British Columbia 12 percent each. Most U.S. and Western European cases involved the service sector (56 and 54 percent, respectively). Only 5 percent of the U.S. cases and 7 percent of the Western European cases involved the resource sector.

Of the 518 acquisition cases resolved in 1982-83, 482 were decided and 36 were withdrawn by the applicants before a decision was reached by the Governor in Council. Of the decided cases, 97 percent were allowed.

New businesses (Tables XII to XXI)

The great majority of the 460 reviewable new business applications (95 percent) in 1982-83 involved planned investments of less than \$5 million. The total projected value of investments increased from \$704 million in 1981-82 to more than \$3.4 billion in 1982-83. Over 90 percent of the value of total planned investment was attributable to eight cases in the \$25-million-and-over range.

The service sector's share of new-business cases was 69 percent, followed by manufacturing (28 percent) and the primary sector (3 percent). In terms of the value of planned investment, however, the order was reversed with the primary sector accounting for 70 percent, manufacturing about 22 percent, and the service sector about 8 percent. The average planned investment in the primary sector reached \$173 million, in manufacturing almost \$6 million, and in the service sector \$854 thousand. Machinery, metal fabricating, transportation equipment, electrical products and food and beverages together accounted for nearly 60 percent of the new-business manufacturing cases.

Ontario was involved in about 58 percent of the new-business applications, Quebec in 15 percent, British Columbia in about 9 percent and Alberta in about 8 percent. The other provinces and territories were involved in about 10 percent of the cases. However, when ranked according to share of the value of projected investment, British Columbia ranked first with 65 percent, followed by Alberta (about 25 percent) and Ontario (5 percent).

In 1982-83 the U.S. share of applications remained virtually unchanged at 57 percent, followed by Western Europe (31.5 percent), and "other countries" (11.5 percent). In terms of the value of planned investment, however, "other countries" accounted for almost 74 percent, Western Europe 19 percent, and the United States about 8 percent. The largest single share of planned investment was from Japan (69.6 percent), largely attributable to one investment in British Columbia coal resources. This also explains the large shares of planned investment in British Columbia (65 percent) and in the primary sector (70 percent).

Most U.S. cases involved Ontario (67 percent), British Columbia (9 percent) and Alberta and Quebec (8 percent each). Most Western European cases involved Ontario (41 percent) and Quebec (29 percent). Most applications from "other countries" involved Ontario (57 percent) and British Columbia and Quebec (about 15 percent each).

The number of resolved new-business cases rose 39 percent in 1982-83. Of the 561 resolved cases, 502 were decided and 59 were withdrawn by applicants before a decision was reached by the Governor in Council. Of the decided cases, 91 percent were allowed.

Significant benefit

All investments which, in the opinion of the Government, offer significant benefit to Canada according to the factors set out in subsection 2(2) of the Act, are allowed. Briefly, the factors concern the impact of a proposal on the economy in terms of employment, use of parts and services produced in Canada, exports and so on, the impact on Canadian participation, on industrial efficiency and technological development, and on competition, and the compatibility of a proposal with enunciated national and provincial economic and industrial policies. The weight given to each of the factors relevant to a particular case necessarily varies according to the nature of the proposal, the sector in which the investment is to occur, the region in which it is to be made, the kinds of undertakings, if any, offered by the applicant, and other factors and circumstances unique to each case.

There was a large increase in planned investment and employment benefits resulting from acquisition and new-business proposals allowed in 1982-83 under the Foreign Investment Review Act. According to Agency estimates, more than \$3 billion worth of planned new investment could result from proposals allowed in 1982-83, which is almost double the value of planned new investment recorded in 1981-82 proposals. The growth in employment benefits was just as encouraging, rising from 19,000 jobs in 1981-82 to 31,000 in proposals allowed in 1982-83. A noteworthy aspect of the employment benefits was that over 3,500 jobs in 1981-82 and almost 5,700 in 1982-83 were jobs saved as a result of the acquisition of failing businesses. The 89-percent increase in planned new investment and the 61-percent increase in employment benefits were attributable in part to the greater number of cases decided in 1982-83 re-

sulting from measures to streamline the review process. Another contributing factor was the larger average size of investment allowed in 1982-83.

The table below provides a breakdown of the investment and employment benefits. Readers should keep in mind that these estimates are not comparable to the statistics found in Appendix A of the Annual Report because they are based on allowed proposals whereas the latter are based on all reviewable proposals.

To further illustrate the variety of benefits that will result from cases allowed in 1982-83, there follow descriptions of three allowed proposals, one in each of the three broad industrial sectors. In each case the permission of the applicant to release this information was sought and obtained, because otherwise, it may not legally be divulged.

One case was the allowed acquisition by the British Petroleum Company Limited of London, England, of Selco Inc. of Toronto, a subsidiary of Selection Trust Limited of the United Kingdom, a company engaged in the exploration for and the production of minerals, and the provision of exploration services and equipment to the mining industry. In support of its proposal British Petroleum undertook, among other things, to cause Selco to increase its exploration program from an annual average of \$3.2 million to about \$7 million and to maintain that level of expenditure through at least 1986, subject to normal competitive and commercial considerations. It also undertook to seek to have Selco's technical services and systems used in mining exploration ventures in which the BP group is engaged and to place no restraints on Selco with respect to exports. British Petroleum further undertook to achieve substantially increased Canadian ownership in the businesses and activities of Selco through a combination of increased equity and direct participation in projects. The proposal was found to be of benefit to Canada in terms of its impact on employment, investment, exports, Canadian participation and technological development.

Another example of benefits to Canada is provided in the allowed proposal by Soprema S.A. of Strasbourg, France, to establish a new business in Quebec which will manufacture and distribute specialized heavy-duty roofing products. In addition to introducing new technology to Canada, Soprema's investment is expected to bring a number of other benefits to Canada. For example, Soprema undertook to invest \$1 million in the acquisition of land and buildings and an additional \$1 million in the purchase of machinery and equipment in Canada. Soprema will create 25 new jobs during the first two years of activity if a projected sales volume is reached, will train employees in France, and will bring its French technical experts to Canada to train Canadian personnel in the manufacture and installation of Soprema's roofing products. Soprema also undertook to provide the new business unrestricted and exclusive access to the applicant's technology and know-how, and to establish a product development laboratory in Canada. The day-to-day management of the new business will be in the hands of Canadians.

A third example was the allowed acquisition proposal by the Prudential Insurance Company of America of Newark, New Jersey to acquire control of Bache Halsey Stuart Canada Limited and Halsey Stuart Corporate Services Limited, both of Toronto and both wholly-owned subsidiaries of Bache & Group Inc. of New York, New York. Bache Canada is engaged in financial activities including securities brokerage, trading, underwriting and distribution; customer financing; commodities futures and so on. Halsey is a business which owns the premises and equipment used by Bache Canada. Bache Canada is expected to establish three new branch offices in Canada and create 30 jobs. In addition Bache Canada will continue to provide to Canadian investors comprehensive services related to foreign securities, which are not substantially available from other sources. The change of control will also give Bache Canada greater autonomy in its management, will provide greater Canadian participation in its direction, and will permit new Canadian participation in ownership.

The three examples cited are only an illustration of the range and value of the benefits associated with allowed cases. Increased employment, new investment and increased processing or use of Canadian parts and services are among the most common benefits. Other benefits of foreign investments have included enhanced research and development, increased Canadian participation, penetration of new export markets and improved competition. The reader may refer to appendices B and C of this report for a complete list of the cases decided during the year under review and the benefits associated with them.

OPINIONS

Two types of opinion are provided to foreign investors on request: first, subsection 4(1) of the Act authorizes the Minister to give opinions as to whether or not an investor is a "non-eligible person" (i.e. non-Canadian), and as to whether or not a new or acquired business is, or would be, related to a non-eligible person's existing business in Canada; second, the Agency gives its own opinions, under certain circumstances, on whether or not a proposed or actual investment is reviewable under the Act. Ministerial opinions are formally binding on the Minister for a period of two years, provided that all material facts are disclosed at the time the application is made and that these facts remain substantially unchanged. Agency opinions are not binding on the Minister.

In 1982-83, nine ministerial opinions were given on the question of whether or not an applicant was a non-eligible person under the Act. Eight of these opinions were to the effect that the applicants were not non-eligible persons, and one opinion was given to the effect that an applicant was a non-eligible person. In addition, three applicants withdrew their applications before an opinion was given. Of the opinions given, six were renewals of earlier opinions, following the expiry of the two-year period.

The Minister also gave six favourable opinions on "relatedness". The establishment of a business in Canada by a non-eligible person is not reviewable if the new business is related to a business already being carried on by that person in Canada. Three applications were withdrawn before an opinion was given. The number of Agency opinions on reviewability remained high in 1982-83. This indicates that investors are well aware of the usefulness of this more informal type of contact with the Agency.

SURVEILLANCE

The Foreign Investment Review Act empowers the Minister to require that a notice in the prescribed form be filed when a non-eligible person proposes to make or has made an investment which is subject to review and has failed to file notice.

In 1982-83, numerous reports from the news media and unsolicited information from individuals and companies resulted in 172 detailed investigations concerning proposed or actual acquisitions of Canadian business enterprises or the establishment of new businesses in Canada, where no notice had been filed. These investigations led directly to the filing of 70 acquisition and new-business notices.

ENFORCEMENT

All cases decided under the Act are followed up to ensure that investors are meeting the terms and conditions of their allowance, or in disallowed cases, to ensure that investors are not proceeding with the in-

vestment contrary to the Governor in Council decision. In 1982-83, in accordance with established procedures, the Enforcement Division monitored the implementation of plans and undertakings provided by investors in 1,275 proposals that had been allowed. In addition, 53 disallowed cases were monitored to ensure compliance with the decision of the Governor in Council.

The Government recognizes that after the allowance of a proposal, economic and other circumstances may arise that would make it impossible for an investor to fulfil his commitments, and provides for the renegotiation of undertakings when necessary. In 1982-83 most investors, whose proposed investments had been allowed, had met their undertakings. However, due to the depressed economic climate it was necessary to renegotiate certain undertakings in a larger number of cases than in previous years.

LEGAL PROCEEDINGS

The Foreign Investment Review Act authorizes the Minister to initiate legal proceedings in any case where the investor fails to file notice as required by the Act, or fails to meet the terms and conditions of his investment as set out in his investment notice or in the plans and undertakings connected with it, or fails to comply with an order of disallowance.

Ambassador Bridge

Central Cartage Company and the Detroit International Bridge Company (DIBC), owners of the Ambassador Bridge linking Windsor and Detroit, commenced proceedings in the United States District Court in Michigan against the Crown, various ministers and officials and past officials of FIRA for alleged losses arising out of the Government's disallowance of the acquisition of control by the plaintiffs of the Canadian side of the bridge. The action is being defended, and the trial in the U.S. court in Michigan to hear Canada's application to have the proceeding dismissed was set for June 1983.

British Columbia Forest Products Limited (BCFP) and Western Forest Products Limited (Western)

In November 1981, BCFP and Western together applied to the Federal Court, Trial Division, for a declaration that they are not non-eligible persons under the FIR Act. In connection with this application, BCFP and Western sought and obtained an interim injunction against the Minister of Industry, Trade and Commerce and the Commissioner of the Agency taking any action against them until their status is determined by the courts. The appeal of the order granting the interim injunction was heard June 9, 1982 by the Federal Court, Appeal Division and dismissed. By the end of the year under review no date had been set by the court for the hearings on the declaration action.

Gotaverken Energy Systems Ltd.

After disallowance of a new-business proposal that Gotaverken had submitted under reserve of its rights, the company commenced proceedings in the Federal Court, Trial Division, for a declaration that its investment was not a new business under the FIR Act and therefore was not reviewable, and sought an interim injunction to restrain the Minister and the Agency from taking any action. The court adjourned the injunction application May 18, 1982, pending outcome of a similar case.

KSC, Ltd.

The new-business investment proposal by KSC (formerly Kero-Sun Canada, Ltd.) was disallowed April 16, 1981, and May 6, 1982. In June 1982, an application was made to the Federal Court, Trial Division, for an Order rendering the investment by KSC nugatory. The trial was held August 26 and 27, 1982, but judgment had not been given by the end of 1982-83.

Oilfield Fluids, Inc.

Oilfield's proposal to acquire Brinadd of Canada Ltd. was disallowed September 3, 1982. Oilfield contended that the transaction was not reviewable and that, consequently, the disallowance order was of no effect. In February 1983, an application was made to the Federal Court, Trial Division, for an Order

rendering the investment by Oilfield nugatory. The trial date was scheduled for May 18, 1983, in the Federal Court in Calgary.

Trio-Kenwood Inc.

In 1981, criminal proceedings were commenced in Provincial Court against Trio-Kenwood for failure to respond to a ministerial demand to file notice of its investment. On March 3, 1982 the accused was acquitted. The Attorney General for Canada filed a notice of appeal, but no date has yet been set. Because Trio-Kenwood filed notice and the Governor in Council allowed the investment March 3, 1983, the application, commenced in December 1981, for an order rendering the investment nugatory was discontinued.

ADMINISTRATION


For fiscal year 1982-83, the Agency was assigned a budgetary allotment of \$5,862,000 and 125 person-years. The actual expenditure was \$5,778,573 and 125 person-years were utilized. During the year, administrative activities continued to be carried out in accordance with the policies and procedures of the Treasury Board and the Public Service Commission. The job classification changes required by the introduction of the Senior Management category were completed, and an improved procedure for the performance review and appraisal of all Agency employees was introduced.

Organization of the Agency

The Foreign Investment Review Agency, whose sole responsibility is to advise and assist the Minister responsible for the administration of the Act, has three operational units: Compliance Branch, Assessment Bureau and Policy, Research and Communications Branch. Their functions and responsibilities are described below. All units of the Agency are supported by the Personnel and Administration Division, which reports directly to the Commissioner. Legal services are provided to the Agency by Department of Justice advisors.

COMPLIANCE BRANCH

The Compliance Branch is responsible for ensuring that the legal requirements of the Act are met.




The Rulings Division receives and verifies notices from investors who submit their investment proposals for review under the Act. It provides informal advice to investors, their counsel and Agency officials on the applicability of the Act and assists the Minister in discharging his statutory responsibility for issuing formal opinions on the eligibility status of applicants and on whether or not the proposed new business activities are related to existing activities of a business.

The Enforcement Division carries out a program of surveillance to identify reviewable transactions for which notices have not been filed and ensures that they are submitted for review under the Act. It regularly monitors the implementation of plans and undertakings offered by investors whose applications have been allowed. It also ensures that investors whose proposals have been disallowed by the Governor in Council comply with the orders of disallowance within a reasonable period of time. This may involve making sure that new businesses which may have already been established cease operating; causing and monitoring the divestiture of an acquired Canadian business enterprise; and making certain that investment proposals that are disallowed are not implemented. The Enforcement Division also conducts investigations and inspections, informally or formally under the authority of the Act, into apparent instances of failure to comply with the Act, including implementation of investment proposals without Governor in Council approval, or on terms different from those contained in the proposal. And, it advises the Minister to invoke, when necessary, the remedial provisions of the Act (injunctions, nugatory orders, or orders to comply with undertakings).

ASSESSMENT BUREAU


The Assessment Bureau, which is at the heart of the Agency's operations, analyses investment proposals against the factors for the assessment of significant benefit to Canada. It has three branches, each carrying out the same functions in relation to one of the three broad sectors of the economy, namely: Construction and Services; Manufacturing Industries; and Resource Industries. In addition, a small-business group provides rapid analysis and assessment of small business proposals in the manufacturing and service sectors.



In all four units the analysis is based primarily on information provided by the investor in his notice and information on companies and sectors provided by federal departments and agencies with policy responsibilities and expertise in the industry sectors involved. The Bureau also maintains direct contact with provincial governments in order to determine how investment proposals relate to their industrial and economic policy objectives. Following this analysis, the Bureau advises and assists the Minister in his assessment of the proposals. The sections in this report on the caseload and significant benefits provide further insight into the work of the Assessment Bureau.

POLICY, RESEARCH AND COMMUNICATIONS BRANCH

The Policy, Research and Communications Branch is responsible primarily for research and analysis in support of Agency operations and the development of government policy related to foreign investment. It reviews results achieved through the administration of the Act and helps to develop new approaches to improve the effectiveness of the program.



The Policy Research Division briefs ministers, senior Agency officials, Canadian businessmen, the international investment community and other interest groups on the many issues related to Canada's foreign investment policy. Other functions include responding to questions from members of Parliament and senators and from the general public, receiving visitors at the Agency who seek information on the program and the Act, and providing speakers for seminars and engagements on various topics surrounding the issue of foreign investment in Canada. Policy research is the centre of the Division's work, and to this end, it participates in the Interdepartmental Committee on International Investment Policies (which is chaired by the Department of External Affairs and is concerned with a host of international issues, many of which have major implications for foreign investment policy) and participates in the work of the Committee on International Investment and Multinational Enterprises of the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development. The Division also carries out a wide range of research projects on various aspects of foreign direct investment, including the behaviour of multinational enterprises.

The Industrial and Corporate Analysis Division is responsible for advice and analysis on industrial and corporate performance in support of the assessment and enforcement functions of the Agency. Equally important is the advice it continues to provide in the determination of whether or not proposed acquisition or new business investments are related to the existing business of applicants. The Division provided the economic analysis for 93 enquiries on relatedness, as a complement to the legal considerations involved, and carried out 150 studies in support of the Agency's assessment and enforcement roles.


The Statistics Unit compiles and maintains data on investments reviewed and on the review process for purposes of internal management, reporting and research. The unit provides statistical analysis in support of the Agency's information program, including responses to parliamentary and other enquiries.


The objective of the Communications Division is to ensure that foreign investors, their governments, their advisors and the general public fully understand the nature, objectives and requirements of the Foreign Investment Review Act, through publications and other means of communication. Among the publications are annual and quarterly reports on activities under the Act, working papers and information for foreign investors and their legal advisors. The Division also participates in the development of the Agency's communication policy and programs.

REVIEW PROCESS

As soon as a notice outlining an investment proposal is received by the Foreign Investment Review Agency, it is examined by the Compliance Branch to determine whether or not the proposal is reviewable and whether the notice contains all of the information prescribed by the Foreign Investment Review Regulations. If the proposal is judged reviewable and complete, it is passed on to the Assessment Bureau for evaluation based on the benefit factors outlined in the Act. Frequently, during this stage, information additional to that contained in the notice is sought and obtained through contacts with the applicant and consultations with appropriate federal departments. The proposal is also circulated to the province or provinces that would be significantly affected by the investment for their views and comments. Once all the necessary information has been assembled the case is then referred to the Minister, together with an assessment by the Agency of the perceived effects of the investment by reference to the factors prescribed in subsection 2(2) of the Act. If the Minister concludes that the investment is likely to result in significant benefit to Canada he must make a recommendation to the Governor in Council that the investment be allowed. If not, the applicant is informed accordingly. The applicant then has the opportunity to make further representations. When those representations are completed the case is referred to the Minister a second time for a final decision as to what his recomendation will be.
