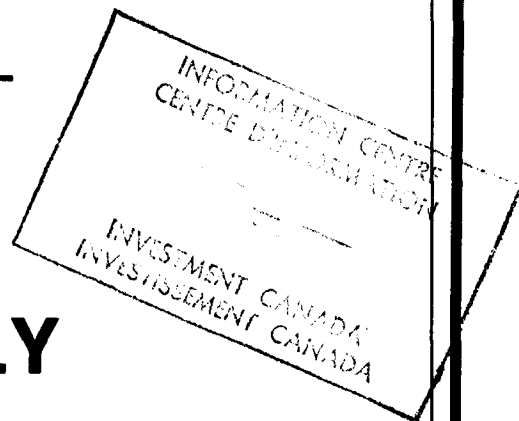

QUARTERLY REPORT

POLICY AND OTHER DEVELOPMENTS

On February 12, 1980, during the course of the federal election campaign, the Right Honourable P.E. Trudeau, speaking as Leader of the Liberal Party, outlined proposals to broaden and strengthen the Foreign Investment Review Act. These included: a periodic performance review of large foreign firms; publication of large foreign takeover bids; and financial assistance to Canadian companies wishing to compete against foreign takeovers or repatriate foreign ownership of assets.

On March 3, 1980, the Honourable Herb Gray was appointed Minister of Industry, Trade and Commerce and consequently became the Minister responsible for the administration of the Foreign Investment Review Act.

REVIEW ACTIVITIES

Applications

The number of reviewable applications received in the first quarter of 1980 (193) was greater than that of the previous quarter (183). This increase is due entirely to the higher number of new-business proposals which rose from 91 to 101.

Of the 92 acquisition applications, only 44 were from U.S. investors. This latter figure is substantially below the level of other recent quarters. There was, however, an increase in applications from U.K. and other West European investors (to 20 and 21 respectively). As usual, Ontario led with 53 cases, followed by Quebec (14), British Columbia (10) and Alberta (9). Well over half of the cases (52) concerned the service sector, whereas manufacturing and resource industries drew considerably fewer cases, 36 and 4 respectively. A majority of the projected acquirees had assets of less than \$2 million and most employed fewer than 100 employees.

About two-thirds of the 101 new-business applications were from the United States (66), while 7 were from the United Kingdom, 23 from the rest of Western Europe and 5 from elsewhere. Ontario was the province most frequently involved (54 cases), followed by Alberta and British Columbia (15 each), and Quebec (12). With 61 cases, the service sector again drew the most cases, with manufacturing and resources following quite far behind (26 and 14 cases respectively). Over 80 percent of the cases involved planned investments of less than \$1 million and over 90 percent of the proposed new businesses were to employ fewer than 100 employees. Nevertheless the total value of proposed investments rose substantially in this quarter, largely as a result of several applications involving investments of over \$10 million.

Resolved Cases

The number of resolved cases dipped to 212 in the first quarter compared to the 227 of the last quarter of 1979. Just over 87 percent of the cases were allowed, 8 percent disallowed and the others withdrawn by the applicants prior to a decision being made.

The number of resolved acquisition cases decreased from 113 in the last quarter of 1979 to 100 in the first quarter of 1980. Of these, 88 were allowed, 7 disallowed and 5 withdrawn prior to a decision being made.

One allowed acquisition proposal which, with the permission of the applicant, was described in some detail in the news release of January 28, 1980 was the acquisition by Phillips Cables Limited of NT Cable, the power cable business of Northern Telecom Canada Limited, and of the ITT Wire & Cable Division of ITT Industries of Canada Ltd. Both NT Cable and ITT Cable manufacture and distribute copper electrical building wire and cable and power cable products. Phillips Cables, which is controlled by BICC Limited of the United Kingdom, saw its first proposal disallowed in December 1979, having failed to show significant benefit to Canada. The applicant revised its application and offered a number of new and improved undertakings including significant expenditures on new equipment and capital improvements, job creation, increased exports, import replacement and research and development. Specifically, Phillips Cables will spend \$5 million on new equipment and capital improvements, in addition to expenditures required for relocating NT Cable's machinery and equipment from Lachine to the ITT Cable plant in St. Jerome. As a result of these expenditures, Phillips sales volume is expected to increase substantially, resulting in the creation of about 150 jobs over the next five years. Phillips Cables will more than double the value of its exports and will substitute Canadian-made goods for approximately \$1 million worth of products which ITT Cable currently imports. Phillips undertook to offer employment to all ITT Cable employees. Northern Telecom retained responsibility for placement of its NT Cable employees. Phillips also undertook to spend over \$1 million a year on research and development, a figure which is more than double the value of current R&D expenditures. The applicant further undertook to provide for meaningful Canadian participation in its equity, direction and management. One factor which makes this transaction even more beneficial is that Northern Telecom fully intended to withdraw from the electrical building wire and cable business, irrespective of the Government's ultimate decision. Another factor worth noting is that, given the current overcapacity in this particular industry, the Phillips Cables transaction will contribute to a more orderly restructuring of the industry in Canada than would otherwise occur.

At 112, the number of resolved new-business cases changed very little from that recorded for the last quarter of 1979. Of these 98 were allowed, 11 disallowed and 3 withdrawn prior to a decision being made.

A new-business case which was described in a news release of March 18, 1980 concerned a proposed investment by Avco Canadian Engineering Limited, a wholly-owned subsidiary of Avco Corporation of the United States. The proposed new-business, to be located in Brampton (Ontario), will perform mechanical design work for the aerospace, transportation, marine and farm equipment industries, as well as the design of jigs and tools for industry in general. The transaction was judged to be beneficial in terms of job creation, new investment, use of Canadian parts and services, additional exports, Canadian participation, enhanced technological development and innovation. Among other things, Avco undertook to establish, within 60 days of the allowance of the proposal, a manpower plan in consultation with the appropriate Canada manpower centre. The

significance of this undertaking is that it will ensure maximum opportunities for Canadians who are not now working in the aerospace industry, but who would like to be. Another undertaking, which has wide-ranging implications, is that Avco will award to Canadian manufacturers approximately 50 percent of all manufacturing which is generated by development work of the new business and which is under its control. A third published undertaking concerns Canadian equity participation in the new business. Subject to certain specified conditions, Avco undertook to sell, within five years of the allowance of the proposal, a significant portion of its equity ownership of the business to Canadian residents.

OTHER ACTIVITIES

Opinions. During the first quarter the Minister gave four opinions on eligibility under Section 4(1) of the Act. Three involved the renewal of opinions given in previous years to Alcan Aluminum Limited, Dome Mines Limited and Dome Petroleum Limited, that they were considered to be eligible persons within the meaning of the Act. A fourth company, Nu-West Group Limited, was given a similar opinion for the first time.

Surveillance. The Act authorizes the Minister to require non-Canadians who are proposing to make, or have made, a reviewable investment to file the prescribed notice with the Agency. Under its program of surveillance the Agency monitors news media reports of mergers, acquisitions and the establishment of new businesses. Unsolicited information is also received from individuals and companies. Detailed investigations of such reports are carried out as necessary.

During the first quarter of 1980, surveillance activity led to the initiation of 40 detailed investigations as a result of which six notices were filed under the Act.

Enforcement. Following procedures which have been established to monitor, at annual intervals, the implementation of plans and undertakings provided by investors whose applications were allowed, 274 cases were monitored for compliance in this quarter. Special investigations and on-site inspections were undertaken in a number of cases.

Legal proceedings. On March 31, 1980, the Federal Court granted an indefinite extension of the injunction against Central Cartage Co. of Sterling Heights, Michigan and Fallbridge Holdings Limited of Toronto. The Order of the Federal Court had been made initially on June 19, 1979, enjoining Central Cartage and Fallbridge from, among other things, taking certain actions in relation to the corporations owning the Ambassador Bridge connecting Detroit and Windsor.
